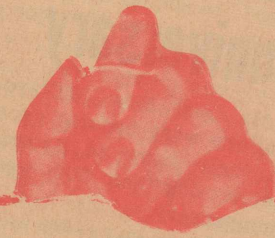

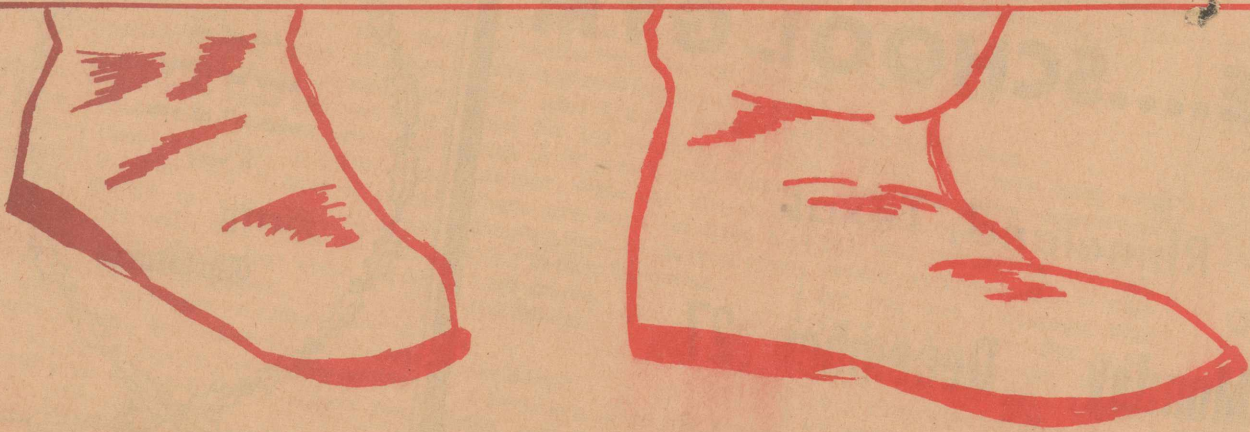

Samples Of Cotton Totaling 78,500

Sample receipts were sufficient to total 6700 samples classed for the week ending December 17th at the USDA Cotton Division Office in Munday. This brings the seasons total to 78,500 according to A.D. Peebles in charge of the office.

The amount of cotton classed in the white grades was unchanged from the past week totaling 26 percent. The Light Spotted grades amounted to 68 percent and spotted grades 6 percent. Predominant grades averaged: 6 percent Middling, 15 percent Strict Low Middling, 34 percent Middling Light Spotted, 31 percent Strict Low Middling Light Spotted and 5 per-

cent Middling Spotted. Staple lengths ran 3 percent 7/8 of an inch shorter, 22 percent 29/32, 47 percent 15/16, 16 percent 31/32, 12 percent one inch and longer.

The percent of cotton with a micronaire reading of 3.6 through 4.8 was unchanged compared to last week and amounted to 85 percent of the classing total. Five percent read 3.2 and below, 6 percent 3.3 through 3.5, 4 percent 4.9 and higher.

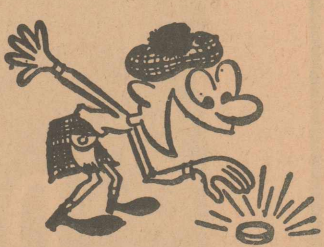



LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Friends,

Today the Queen Mother of Belgium, Elizabeth, has been buried. Her death has been a great loss to the people here. Their grief is not too different than that felt by Americans over the loss of President Kennedy. In this atmosphere of grief there is also joy, for the time when we participate again in the event of our Lord's birth is arriving soon. The Advent Season is here and with it a wonderful sense of expectancy that the love and the power of God has overcome the powers of this world, even death. In this Advent Season the Dungan family rejoices that God has not left us desolate nor without hope in this world. He is making His power and His love known to us now just as He did at the First Christmas.

We have come to like Belgium and its people. Brussels is a city of historic interest and the center of the European common market as well. Earlier this fall I visited Waterloo, a small village and monument on the southern outskirts of Brussels and only 12 miles from our apartment. In November we saw an exhibit of Renaissance paintings including those by Peter Paul Rubens, the greatest Flemish-Belgian painter, and by Van Dyke, whose portraits are exquisite. We have been fascinated by the great buildings with their gothic architecture—churches, government buildings, and especially the sixteenth and seventeenth century guild halls in the Grand Place in the heart of Brussels.

Our purpose here is to learn French, the official language of Congo. Sarah and I are attending separate schools, because of the demands on her time at home. I am in school Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Ecole d'Administration, a government operated school. Sarah goes three afternoons a week to L'Alliance Francaise, a privately operated school. Both of us have a tutor for two hours each week. We are fortunate to have a Belgian lady who is a very competent baby sitter.

While all this higher learning goes on, John (b. Nov. 8, 1963) and Deborah Ruth (b. Jan. 29, 1965) are learning on a high level also—usually in our third floor apartment. John is talking in sentences now, climbing on things, counting 1, 2, 6 and using his twenty teeth to eat like a growing boy. Our big-little girl, Debbie, is now walking and loves to toddle after her big brother. She and John are in good health and enjoy playing with one another more and more.

We wish you a most joyous Christmas and a blessed New Year. We would like to write each of you personally but since we cannot do this next-best thing. You may be sure that as we make out our mailing list we think a special message to each person. May God's love be with you all.


