

BANK ROBBERY.

The Paying Teller of the Louisiana National Bank.

GETS AWAY WITH \$190,000.

His Story-Sixteen Years Ago by Mistake Ho Overpaid Some Check by

NEW ORLEANS, LA., Oct. 22 .-The Louisiana National bank to-day made public the fact that it had been upon any sort of security, whether so as to lay the condition of the bank before the depositors and assure them of the protection, which has been accomplished. The robsome hesitation about accepting the story told by the paying teller, Mr. Eugene Garcia, of how and under what circumstances he got away with

HE IS AN OLD MAN of excellent Creole family and has held the position for years. He was a quiet economical old gentlemen, a married man who lived without show or display in a cheap house in the Creole section of the city. He had no expensive traits, was not dissipated, and as far as known did not speculate, and he is about the last man in New Orleans who would have been suspected of a big robbery like this. According to his own story he discovered sixteen years ago that he was \$50,000 short in his accounts. He had by some mistake which he never understood, overpaid some check, but to whom he paid the money or how the mistake occurred he he could not say. Fearing that if it was discovered he would be accused of stealing, or under any cir-

cumstances discharged and HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR THE LOSS, Garcia decided to conceal it, hoping to make good the money in some way. He resorted to a simple but dangerous trick. In making up the packages of money he would place a few hundred dollar bills at the top and bottom, the rest of the package being composed of one-dollar bills. and \$10,000, although only containing about \$500 and \$1200, and stored in the vault of the bank, only occasionally being used.

Garcia finding that his little scheme was not discovered became bolder, took a little money from the bank reon, received a big consignment of schemes in the hope that he would at per bushel. 


