## Haskell Elementary sets Pre-k, K registrations

Haskell Elementary School will have registration for Prekindergarten and Kindergarten for the 2017-2018 school year on the following dates:

Tues. April 18, 3 and 4 year old Prekindergarten registration is from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. in the elementary library.

Tuesday, May 2, is Kindergarten registration and screening. New students not currently enrolled in Haskell Elementary School will be registered and screened from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. or 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m. in the elementary office.

To be eligible for enrollment in Prekindergarten, a child must be 3 or 4 years old on Sept. 1, 2017 and must be unable to speak and comprehend the English

language; or qualify for free or reduced lunches; or be homeless; or be the child of an active duty member of the armed forces of the United States; or be the child of a member of the armed forces of the United States who was injured or killed while serving on active duty; or has ever been in foster care. However, we are hoping to offer Prekindergarten for all 4 year olds. If you are interested in this program for your child, please be sure to register Tues., April 18.

To attend Kindergarten, a child must be 5 years old on Sept. 1, 2017. Only students registering for Kindergarten who are not currently enrolled in Haskell Elementary School need to attend registration with their parents. All students

currently enrolled in Haskell Elementary School will be pulled from their class to be screened. Their parents do not need to attend registration.

PPCD (Preschool Program for Children with Disabilities) is for children ages 3 to 5 that may be developmentally delayed in areas such as learning, speech and/or emotional skills. If your child turns 3 during the 2017-2018 school year, you can call the elementary office at 864-2654 at that time to schedule an appointment to have your child screened.

Parents should bring their driver license and their child's birth certificate, immunization record and social security card to registration. Your child will not be able to start school in the fall

until we have all these items on file.

It is possible for some children to qualify for

more than one of these programs. Call Peggy Adams at 864-2654 if you have any questions.

Shortly after the bombing of Pearl Harbor, he and his good friend John Larned joined the U.S. Army Air Corps hoping to be able to serve their entire military career together. They were both sent to Fort Sill, Oklahoma to be inducted and later served time in Lubbock where he and his wife shared a house with John and Florence. On Feb. 2, 1943 they were assigned to Pampa and moved their spouses with them. John served as secretary to the Colonel and would make a special point of removing Rob's name from KP duty. From there, John was sent to New York and Rob was sent to Chicago. In Chicago, the army wanted to make Rob a mess hall cook. He did not know how to cook and did not want to learn. He asked someone how to get out of the

cooking duty and was told to mess up several times in a row and he would be reassigned. It worked, and he was sent to Florida to work in the aircraft maintenance area. He served the rest of his military time in Florida and was discharged in 1946.

He eventually moved to Fort Worth and worked for Bell Helicopter until his retirement 25 years later. In 1961, he married Bea Watson to whom he was married for 41 years.

Rob renewed his driver's license at the age of 102 and continued to drive almost daily to the Civic Center for domino competition with his great friends, until his health began to fail. Rob was a strong Christian who loved his family dearly and prayed for them daily.

He was preceded in death by Eloise and Bea; his parents, John and Beulah Lackey; his six siblings, Cecil, Lewis and Jay Lackey, Opal Andress, Gladys Davis and Lois Nicholson; and granddaughter, Teresa Soward; and his lifelong friend, John Larned.

# Rule ISD to register pre-K, K

On Wed., April 12, registration for Rule ISD pre-k and kindergarten will be from 1 to 2 p.m. in front of the superintendent's office.

Children who will be 5 years old on or before Sept. 1 may attend kindergarten in the fall, while pre-k students must be four

years old by that time. This registration is to complete paperwork, so it is not necessary that prospective students attend with their parents. Parents of students already enrolled in Rule ISD do not have to attend.

For each student, we will need

1. An up-to-date

immunization record,

2. Social security card,

3. Official birth certificate from the court house

4. The parent's driver's license.

If you cannot bring these items, please attend anyway, but all four items will be needed before the child

starts to school in August.

If you cannot attend, and your child will be attending Rule ISD in the fall, please contact the school at 997-2246 so arrangements can be made to meet with you another time. It is important that this is done before school dismisses in May, if possible.

**Vegetables A to Z: Cabbage**  
**Did you know?**  
 One cup of cabbage only has 25 calories. Cabbage is an excellent source of Vitamins C and K.

Cabbage may help reduce the risk of certain cancers. A fun fact is there are two types of cabbage, red and green.

**What am I looking for?**  
 Look for firm or hard heads that are heavy for their size. Outer leaves should be a good green or red color and free from blemishes. Wash cabbage well before use. Avoid cabbage with wilted or decayed outer leaves or leaves turning yellow.

**Cabbage with peas**  
 1 teaspoon vegetable oil  
 6 cups cabbage, fresh, cut up  
 1 cup frozen green (English) peas  
 Salt and pepper to taste

Heat oil in a non-stick skillet. Add cabbage and peas. Cook over medium heat until cabbage is soft. Remove from heat and add salt and pepper. Serve.

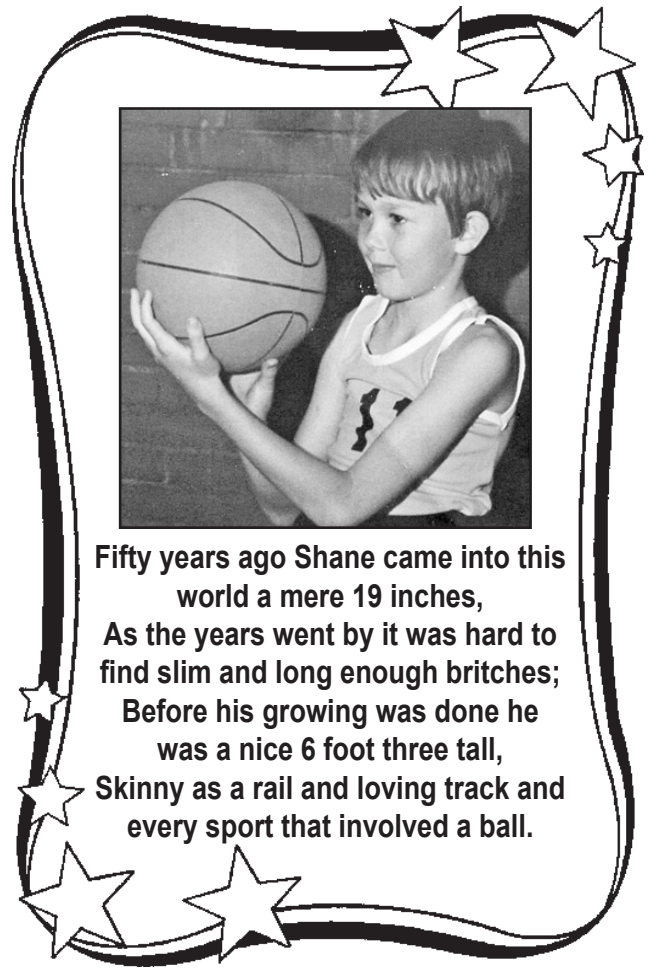

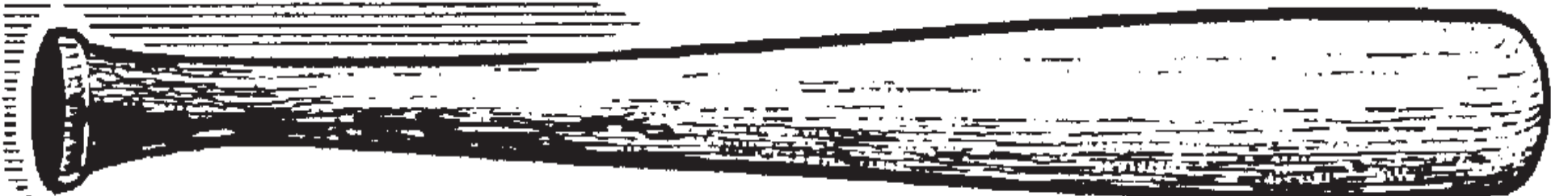
