### SHORTAGE OF BABY CHICKS IN SOUTH THIS SPRING

What! A shortage of baby chicks in the South this spring. Yes according to a recent survey made by the Poultry Department of the Purina Mills through the poultry departments of southern agricultural colleges its representatives in every section of the South.

"The scarcity of baby chicks," the report says, "will be the result of a scarcity of breeding stock in the South. The opinion seemed almost universal on this point. Therefore breeding stock should be given the very best of care in the way of feeding and management so as to furnish enough eggs of high hatchability and of quality to supply the demand of hatcheries.

"Baby chicks should be ordered early this year so that hatcheries will be able to fill your order with chicks of high quality" is the recommendation made following the survey. "Early chicks have the added advantage of making broilers that bring high prices and develop into pullets that produce high priced eggs."
