

Boyce House Leads In Straw Vote for Lieut. Governor

With all polls giving Boyce House a long lead in the race for Lieutenant Governor House's headquarters here said today that such a strong trend has set in for him that there is a likelihood of his winning without a runoff.

The Beldon poll recently gave House a substantial margin in the race. Jim Carroll of the

Houston Press, after a state-wide tour, reported House far in front, and Lewis Nurdyke in a political analysis in the Amarillo Globe-News said he was the strong leader.

Since the polls were taken, sentiment for House has been growing by leaps and bounds. The latest development in his favor is the knocking out of a law which would have prevented 100,000 elderly citizens from voting because they lived in towns of 10,000 or more and had not renewed their exemption certificates.
