KC Elementary Students Must Register Aug. 15

All Knox City elementary children will register for school Tuesday, August 15, from 9 a.m. until 12:00 noon.

Registration will be in the respective home rooms, according to Principal John Mc Gaughey.

A special effort is being made to contact all children five years and older who will be eligible for kindergarten. As these children are entering school for the first time, it is very important that they bring certain records with them when they register. In fact, they cannot begin school without these records.

Mrs. Jo e Clonts, kindergarten teacher, and Mrs. Alton Fitzgerald, school nurse, ask that when a child comes to the kindergarten building to register Tuesday he should bring: (1) parent, (2) birth certificate (a copy can be obtained from the County Clerk's office from the county where the child was born), (3) a complete vaccination record (his card should be completed at the clinic or from your family doctor), (4) \$1.00 for supplies.

Mrs. Fitzgerald also said that any high school student who has not had a diphtheria and tetanus vaccine in the last 10 years must have them before beginning school.

The first full day of school will be the following Monday, August 21.
