ANTI-SALES TAX FORCES OFFER COUNTER PROPOSAL.

Since the Legislature convened in Jariu ary, a militant group of representatives has pondered the course of state affairs and levy a sales tax as a means of finaneing levy a sales tax as a means of financins
the state's social security program. the state's social security program.
This group feels that Texas, of all thy states in the nation, should not turn to th sales tax when it has an abundance eseary tax load.
But when Governor W. Lee O'Daniel rec ommended his transaction tax, he bluntlo told the legislators to take his plan or find some better way
Last week the anti-sales tax group re vealed an answer to the O'Daniel challeng: when 44 representatives signed a bill to finance the social security program through

increases in natural resource and cigarette taxes. Drafted by Rep. G. C. Morris of Greenville, the measure would raise $\$ 16$, 689,720 additional revenue with which to finance a liberalized old age pension program, aid to the blind and to dependent chaldre
