Widespread evidence of this disease, which has caused some schools to close and has indicated that an outbreak of it might come to any village or city of the United States, has caused medical men in all parts of the country to study means by which it may be eradicated. Constant use of antiseptic is being urged as a means to aid the fight against this age-old malady which has recently taken a more serious appearance in this country. The photograph was taken in the Peace Laboratories in New York where scientists are constantly studying the disease in an effort to control it


