A home is not an easy thing to make, she further said; it takes the love, the prayers the sacrifices and all the good that there is in a man and a woman to make a home. In addition to working for good homes, we must all work for better communities, suppress the evil and make clear the path of youth.

The minds of boys and girls like their bodies, can become helplessly warped, crippled and twisted by immorality and delinquency. Parents are either stepping stone or stumbling blocks for their children and Mrs. Cain earnestly urged the parents of Knox City to become useful stepping stones.

The services Tuesday evening was opened by a scripture reading and prayer led by Uncle Joe. Mrs. Cain's address followed and was enlightening to those attending Mrs. Cain's message was one of appeal for better homes as well as one filled with information as to the reasons for child delinquency.

SATURDAY ACCIDENTS ARE NUMEROUS

Duncan Boy Gets Leg Crushed

There were several car accidents happening in Knox City Saturday afternoon and evening, in which a small boy and two larger boys received minor injuries.

About 5:30 Saturday afternoon, a Mexican, driving into the city made a bobble in attempting to park his car and ran upon the side walk knocking a nine year old boy down and injuring one leg. The Mexican has been working for Mr. Ben Farmer some three or four years. Mr. Farmer lives 6 or 7 miles west of the city. The Mexican drove into town and upon seeing a space in which he could park, turned his wheels in the space but failed to get onto his brakes in time. The car bumped upon the sidewalk in front of the picture show. A small boy by the name of Duncan was standing on the sidewalk and was knocked down. The force of the knock crushed the bone in his right leg just above the ankle.

The Mexican accompanied the injured boy with his parents to a doctors office where the former made attempts to pay for the accident. No settlement was made however, Mr. Duncan stating that the boy was not badly hurt and that unless his condition became worse, there will be no settlement to make.

The Mexican was honest and deep ly concerned about the accident. He was in a DeSoto sedan and had two companions.

The boy injured, with his parents lives near Stamford.

About nine o'clock Saturday night Mr. Sam White and Mr. Parr collided. Mr. White was driving a Dodge Standard Six, in second gear going south on main street. Mr. Parr, in a Ford touring, was parked in town and made a fast back turn. Mr. White hit the rear of the ford and ruined the front of his own car. The Dodge had one fender torn off, a bumper off, an axle bent and the radiator cut in too. The repairs to Mr. White's car will amount to about \$40.00 while it is reported the Ford was not hurt.

Saturday night is my unlucky time in town, said Mr. White. If some one doesn't run into me, they will stop in front of me and I hit them, he said. With the setting of the sun he further said, I think I'll get home on Saturday night.

Miss Orsborne's Car Hit

About ten twenty Saturday night Miss Grace Orsborn received a jar when her Ford touring was run into by a Chevrolet roadster.

Miss Orsborn works on Saturday at one of the department stores of Knox City. She had just left the store but remembered something she left and was driving back to town going north when the roadster driven by a boy with three companions, drove deliberately across the road, going to the left of the light post instead of the right, and ran directly into Miss Orsborn. The roadster hit the touring car at the front left fender, almost completely wrecking the ford. One boy was thrown out, his head injured and his body bruised while one other boy received injuries to one arm. Both were treated at the Knox County Hospital and carried to their homes in Rochester.

It is reported the boys were speeding and to avoid hitting another car that was backing out on their side of the street, the driver cut across with the hope of missing everyone.

Those in the roadster were two Hanson boys, a Grimes boy and a Brown boy, all of Rochester. Miss Orsborn was alone.

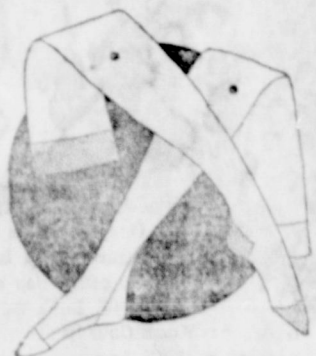

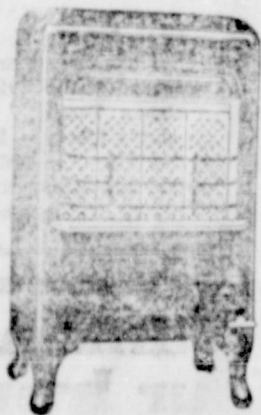

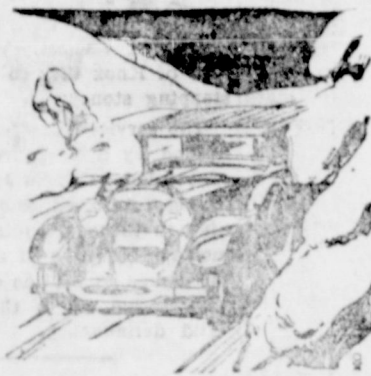

MEXICAN BRUTALLY MURDERED IN TENT HOME WEST OF KNOX CITY

Benito Valquez, a Mexican living in a tent with his wife on the J. T. Osborn farm ten miles west of Knox City, was brutally slain Saturday night October 7. Following an investigation instituted by Sheriff C. R. Elliott and other officers the dead Mexican's wife and two Mexican men are being held in the Knox county jail at Benjamin with indictments charging murder pending against them.

An examination of the body of the dead Mexican revealed that he had been literally cut to pieces by his assailants, there being twenty-three knife wounds on his body and his skull is said to have been fractured in three places. A butcher knife used by the assailants in their death dealing mission.

Having no clue whatever upon which to begin work when he arrived on the scene, Sheriff Elliott summoned E. O. Root, superintendent of identification and bureau expert from San Antonio police department, to assist him in his investigation, and his work was very valuable in presenting the evidence that was presented to the grand jury now in session which resulted in the indictment of Trinidad Valquez, wife of the dead man, and two Mexican men, Sotero Flores and Genaro Fernandez.

In their investigation of the crime officers concluded that a love affair between the dead Mexican's wife and one of the men under indictment furnished the motive for the crime and they have found much evidence pointing in that direction.

In their investigation of the crime and a round-up of the Mexicans in the vicinity one Mexican was taken into custody who did not possess a passport and he is being held for immigration officers for department to Mexico.—Monday Times.

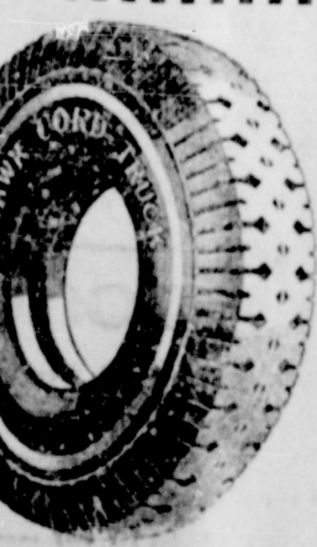

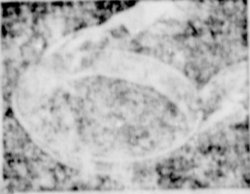
