THREE RINGS AROUND SATURN

Their Composition Has Not Been Definitely Determined.

The inner ring of the planet Sat-"crepe ring" because it is much less brilliant than the others, has a thickness of 2,000 miles, while the ther rings are very much thinner, according to observations made by Prof. William H. Pickering of Harvard, at the Harvard astronomical station at
