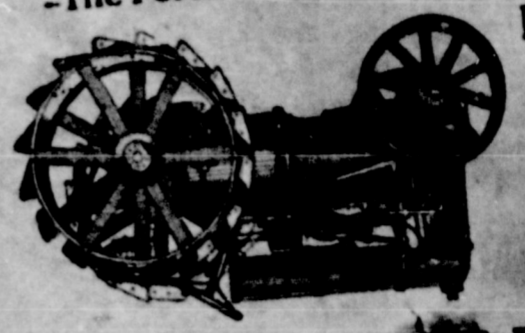

**AN ORDINANCE**

An ordinance entitled an ordinance to establish and regulate a public pound and to regulate and restrain and prohibit the running at large of horses, mules, cattle, sheep, swine, goats and to authorize the restraining impounding and sale of same for the cost of the proceedings and providing a penalty for the violation of this ordinance, and order the destruction of said animals when they cannot be sold.  
 Be it ordained by the city council of the City of Knox City.  
 Sec. 1. That hereafter it shall be unlawful for hogs, goats, cows, calves, oxen, or cattle, horses, Jackasses, Jonnetts, and sheep to roam at large within the corporate limits of the City of Knox City and when so found at large, shall be impounded and sold, as herein after provided.

The Texas Near East Relief Committee plan to start other County Car-Lot shipments if volunteer workers or chairmen can be secured. In releasing this general appeal for old clothing, Charles L. Sanger, Vice President of Sanger Bros., of Dallas, State Chairman for the Near East Relief, said: "All have garments that are not in use. They are hoarded for sentiment, are kept to make over, those out of style, spotted, or too torn to be 'respectable.' "People in Armenia will need these clothes this winter.
