Morales: from front seat to center stage MESQUITE - U.S. Senate candidate Victor Morales is going Prime time.
Morales, whose grass-roots campaign has gained national attention, will address the Democratic National Convention in Chicago in a prime-time speech shortly after 9 p.m. Tuesday. The former Mesquite school teacher gained notoriety earlier this year for conducting his campaign all across Texas from the front seat of his 1992 Nissan pickup.
