

### Cotton Stripping Begins in Area

Cotton harvesting gained momentum this week as fields dried enough for field activity to resume in most of the area serviced by the Munday Cotton Classing Office, reports Shirley A. Sewell, Officer-In-Charge. According to the USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service, 3,319 samples were classed this week bringing our season's total

Quality statistics for the week ending December 24, 1971, show the quality of the cotton classed to be slightly better than the previous week. This week 9 per cent of the cotton graded in the white grades Forty-two per cent of the cotton was classed as Strict Low Middling Light Spotted. Twentyfive per cent graded in the Spotted grades, which was about the same as the previous week, Thirty-one per cent of the cotton classed was reduced in grade,

due to bark or grass, up 9 percentage points over last week. The staple lengths show 15 per cent staple 30, 46 per cent staple 31, 31 per cent staple 32, and 8 per cent staple 33 or longer.

The micronaire readings continue to be good with 97 per cent of the cotton reading in

the desirable range of 3.5-4.9. Pressley fiber strength tests conducted by the USDA's fiber laboratory at College Station show an average breaking strength of 77,000 pounds per square inch.

Cotton prices increased this week with farmers offering freely. Prices received by farmers ranged from 28.75-30.00 cents per pound for all grades offered with staple lengths of 31 through 34.
