## Four Injured in Collision Saturday

Four persons were injured here Saturday when two cars collided at the intersection of Highway 283 and 7th St. just inside the city limits.

Mrs. H. M. Thompson of Knox City is in the Knox County Hospital with both arms fractured, and bruises. Her husband, driver of one of the cars, was treated for a broken finger.

Also injured were two children, Linda Jones, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Jones of Rt. 2, Rule, and Randy Stone, son of Mr. and Mrs. M. R. Stone, who live near Haskell. The Jones girl received broken ribs and a punctured lung, and the Stone youth had a broken collar bone.

## O'Brien to Call \$180,000 School Bond Election

At a public meeting at the O'Brien Baptist Church last Friday night, citizens voted to call a \$180,000 bond election to build and furnish a new school building providing classrooms, a gymnasium and a cafeteria.

The new building would replace the high school building which was destroyed by fire Thursday night, Jan. 2. The building was insured for \$40,000.

Supt. Elvin T. Mathis said about 100 school patrons attended the meeting. Also present were Joseph D. Hinton of Abilene, architect, and his assistants, William M. Collier Jr., consulting engineer, and Wm. E. Fox, consulting engineer, and Ransom Galloway of Lubbock, bonding agent. Mathis presided at the meeting.

Preliminary plans are for the building to house ten classrooms, a library, offices, rest rooms, and storage room. The proposed gymnasium would seat 240 people and have dressing rooms, concessions, office, rest rooms, and storage. Tentative plans call for the cafeteria to dine 120 people, seat 180 people, and to have a kitchen, storage and dressing rooms.

"These are just preliminary plans as presented by the architect at the meeting," Mathis said.

Following the community meeting, members of the board of education met and voted to call the bond election for February 1. They also voted to circulate a petition tomorrow (Friday) to get 20 signatures of property holders in the school district, necessary to call the bond election, Mathis said.

## C of C Manager, Officers to Attend Industrial Conference

George Houston, manager of the Knox City Chamber of Commerce, plans to attend the fifth annual West Texas industrial conference in Abilene Jan. 23.

Houston said several members of the chamber's board of directors will attend and any business man may attend. He asked those interested to contact him.

The conference, sponsored by the West Texas Chamber of Commerce, this year offers a five-point program on industrial development: garment factories, processing agricultural products, mineral resources, industrial foundations, and a study of the potentials of the region.

Houston said there will be no registration or other fees charged those attending the conference. The all-day meeting will be held at the Wooten Hotel in Abilene beginning at 9 a. m. Jan. 23.

The organization and use of industrial foundations will be discussed by John W. Tippitt, assistant research economist of the Texas Engineering Experiment Station at College Station.

Mr. Tate, who has been head of the district the past ten years, remarked that during that time social security has grown until it has become a vital part of our lives, since it is the basic retirement plan for the entire country.

Ten years ago, he said, handling all claims in the 11-county district was a one-man job. Now, he continued, nine people out of ten in Knox County are eligible for social security benefits when they reach retirement age. In addition, there is survivors insurance and disability compensation.

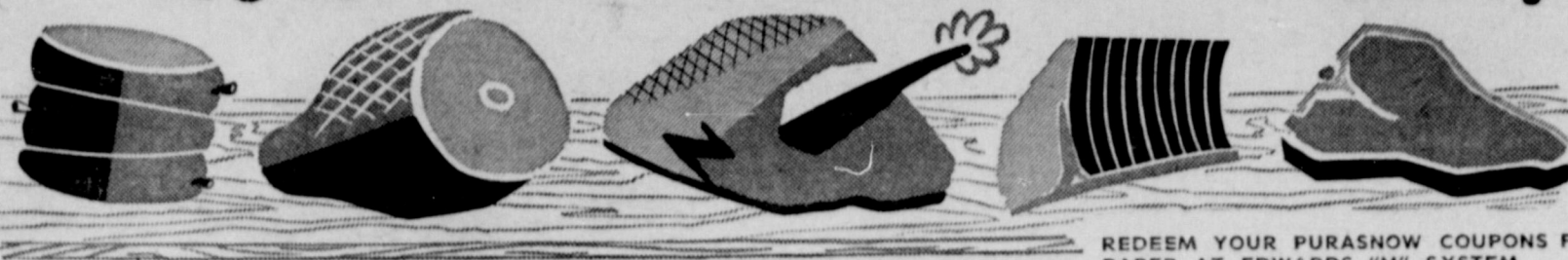
