## AS BOOSTERS WILL BRING FAMOUS BAND

## TOTAL BALES FAR SHORT OF LAST YEAR'S GINNING

According to the latest official report Knox County has ginned only 29,833 bales of cotton for 1928, while in 1927 the total was 48,251. The season of 1928 was drouthy in most sections of the county which accounts for the smaller production. The acreage remains about the same with steady increase from year to year.

## COUNTY SCHOOL TRUSTEE ELECTION

County Judge's Order  
State of Texas:

Whereas, Art. 2676 County of Knox, Revised Civil Statutes 1925 vests the management and control of the public free and high Schools of the County in five County School Trustees, and that each year there shall be elected alternately two County School Trustees and three County School Trustees; and

Whereas, under and by virtue of the operation of said article the terms of the trustees heretofore elected in and for Commissioner's Precinct No 1 and 2 of Knox County, Tex. expire at this time; and

Whereas, the aforesaid article requires that the election officers holding the election for Common School Trustees in Common School districts shall, at the same time and place hold the election for County School Trustees; and

Whereas, said article further requires that the County Judge of the County order said election:

Now, therefore, I, Oliver W. Lee in my official capacity as County Judge of Knox County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on the first Saturday in April A. D. 1929, same being on the 6th day of said month, at the School house, or usual voting places, in common school districts, nos. 1 (Benjamin), 4 (Cottonwood), 12 (League), 13 (Union Grove), 15 (Vera), 16 (Lone Star), 18 (Brock) and 25 (Red Creek) for the purpose of electing a County School Trustee for each of the aforesaid Commissioner's Precincts 1 and 2.

Such County School Trustees shall be qualified voters of the Commissioners' Precinct from which they are elected. They shall be of good moral character able to read and speak the English language, shall be persons of good education and shall be in sympathy with public free schools. The returns of their election shall be made to the County Clerk within five days after such election, to be delivered by said clerk to the Commissioners' Court at their first meeting, to be canvassed and the results declared as in other elections;

That a copy of this order be published in the Knox County Herald and the Benjamin Post, newspapers published in Commissioners' Precincts Nos. 1 and 2 respectively, for four consecutive weeks shall constitute legal notice of said election.

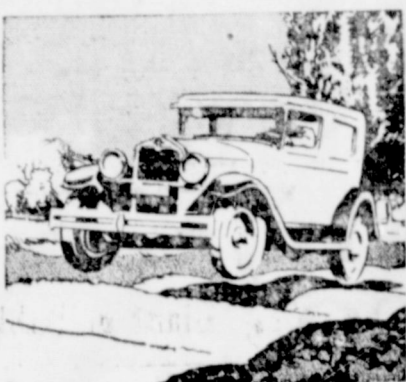
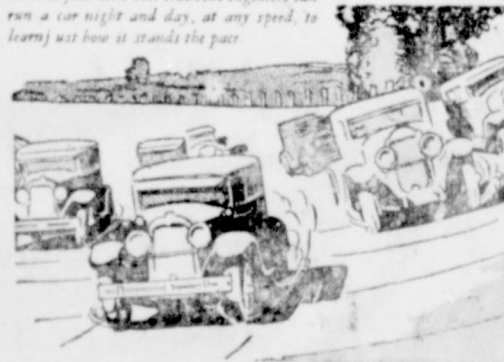

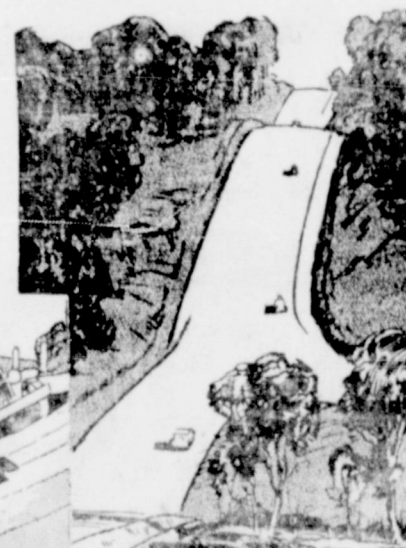
