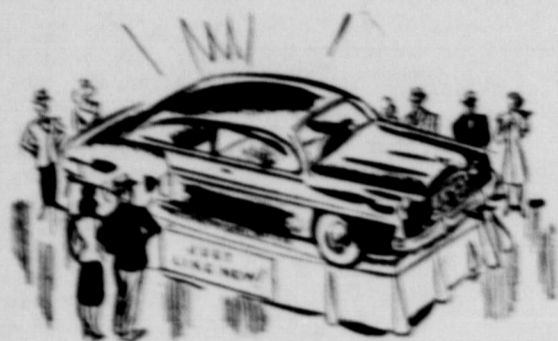

**Nine Boys Receive Sears Program Pigs**

Nine 4-H members of Knox County were announced as winners of registered Duroc pigs distributed by the county agent in connection with the Sears Foundation Swine Program. Letters on "Why I Want a Pig" were submitted to the agent's office, and basis for selection of the winners was content, ability of the boy to care for the pig, and general 4-H work.

Pigs were distributed by Bill Pallmeyer, county agent, on May 24, 25, 26 and 28. Winner of the boar pig was Alton Lee Patterson of Vera, and winners of sow pigs were Johnny Jones of Goree, Glenn Bruce of Sunset, Vernon Davis, Emmett Burleson and Robert Elliott, of Knox City, and William Bellinghausen, Harold Albus and Tommy Decker of Rhineland.

Boys in the 1950 pig program who contributed pigs to this year's winners were Bobby McBeth, Kenneth Day, Doyle Dodson, and Kenneth Hubbard, all of Knox City. Other replacements were obtained from B. B. Bowden, Munday, Clelan Russell, Vera, and the Young County 4-H Club.

The boys will care for the pigs this year and take them to the county show in Munday in September. Winners will then compete in the district show held in connection with the Texas-Oklahoma Fair at Iowa Park. Gilts will be bred to farrow between February 15 and April 15, 1952, and at the age of eight weeks the entire litter will be weighed, showing the advancement of the program. At that time a sow pig will be selected by the county agent to give to a winner in the 1952 swine program, thus making the program continuous and allowing for wider distribution of Duroc pigs in the county. Boys are also encouraged to feed a pen of three market hogs for the fall county show, thereby showing the feeding qualities of the animals.

**SEWELL BILL SUPPORTERS GAIN PARTIAL VICTORY**

Anell Waldrip, as president of the Knox County Farm Bureau, which strongly supported the Sewell Bill during the past session of the Legislature, was assured this week by Senator George Moffet that supporters of the bill had gained some degree of success in the compromise tax bill which was passed by the Legislature.

"The Legislature finally decided to place a tax of approximately one-half cent on each 1,000 cubic feet of gas transported by pipe lines," Senator Moffet said. "The language of this part of the bill is exactly the same as in the Sewell Bill, and to that extent the Sewell Bill supporters gained a victory. Not quite as much of the money will go to farm to market roads as would have been the case if the Sewell Bill had passed. However, the Coisan-Briscoe farm-to-market road law is retained without any crippling amendments, and over all there will be some more money spent in building farm-to-market roads in the next two years than is being spent under the present law. So, progress has been made in the matter of constructing rural roads."

"There is a little doubt, however, as to whether or not the tax levied on pipe lines will stand up in the courts. But now is proper time to get a court decision on this matter, and the tax bill which has been passed will also accomplish that desirable purpose. So, all in all, definite progress has been made and the Farm Bureau has had a big part in bringing about this program."

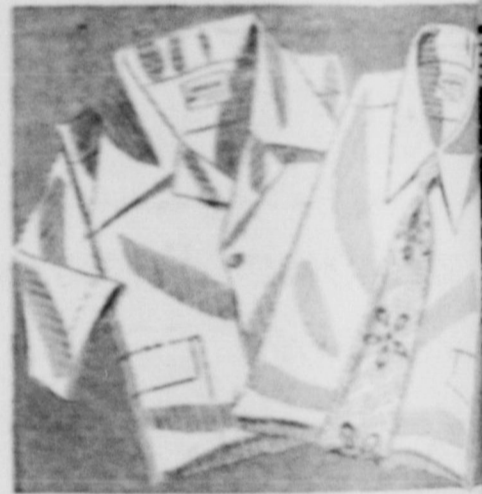

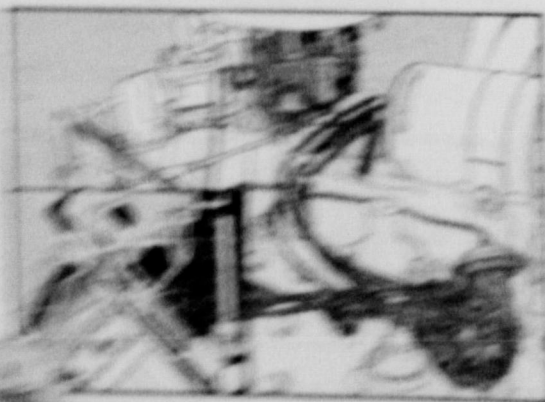

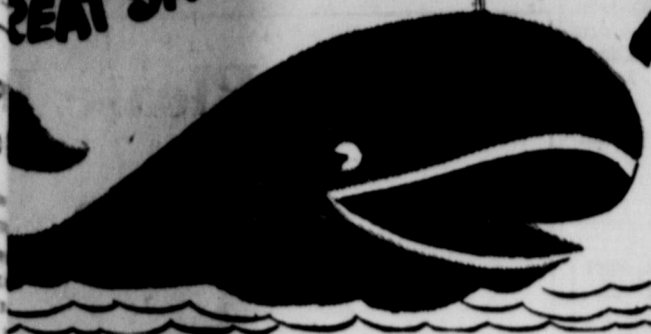
