

#### MICROBES HARD TO KILL

Though some microbes are very tough and can stand great extremes of heat and cold, the majority of them are easily killed if the right methods are used. But what puzzled scientists for many years was that "killed" microbes seemed to be able to come alive again! You could kill them as dead as door nails, but in a very short space of time they would appear in swarms and as lively as arickets! Then a discovery was made. It was found that many microbes bred by means of seeds or spores, which are almost indestructible, save by fire. 
