**The Body of Christ**

To help us understand the nature of the Lord's church it is pictured as a body. Paul said "And he (Christ) is the head of THE BODY, THE CHURCH." Col. 1:18. Also in Eph. 1:22,23 he refers to "THE CHURCH, WHICH IS HIS BODY."

One primary lesson to learn from this is the complete authority of Christ in the church. "Christ is THE HEAD of the church" is the claim made in Eph. 5:23. As this binds us completely to Christ, it releases us from every theory and belief originated by men.

This figure emphasizes a truth of no lesser importance in showing the oneness of the church. The scriptures urge clearly "There is ONE BODY, and one Spirit." Eph. 4:4. It is as inconceivable to think about Christ being head over more than one church, as it is to think about one head controlling a number of physical bodies. Christ died to purchase but one body; he lives again to reign over but one body. "THERE IS ONE BODY." Eph. 4:4.

A third lesson taught by this figure is that individual Christians are members of the body. It is not true, as some teach, that various religious groups are members of the body of Christ. Paul says "Now ye are the body of Christ, and members in particular." I Cor. 12:27. Collectively, Christians are the body of Christ; Individually, they are members of the body. Members are individuals and not groups.

Consider this lesson further with us this Sunday evening at eight o'clock. It deserves your attention; we desire your presence.
