## FALLING WEATHER AND LOW TEMPERATURE ADD TO CROP PROSPECTS

The falling moisture of this week has added considerable moisture to the amount already stored in the ground and the low temperature of recent spells has pulverized the earth to a great depth, freezing out insect life. The heavy snows in the northwest and Rocky Mountain region is another fortunate circumstance for our country as it has been noticed that on such years our rain is always plentiful. The melting of the snow in that region in the spring causes an evaporation that brings our clouds and rain from the right direction. Then, too, if good crops always follow severe winters, the farmers might as well begin to tear down their old barns and build larger ones, for on that basis a bumper yield may be expected.

## COUNTY AGENT ANNOUNCES TERRACING SCHOOL

A very interesting terracing demonstration will be held Feb. 25th on the S. A. Bowden farm which is located one mile east of Munday on the Munday-Goree Highway.

We are fortunate in securing the services of M. R. Bentley terracing specialist of A & M. C. and A. K. (Dad) Short, soil conservation specialist for the Federal Land Bank of Houston. These two men are recognized as the best authority in the state on terracing. They are capable of answering any question, or questions that you may ask them in regard to terracing. Each year, altho you may not be aware of the fact, a portion of your farm is being washed down the Brazos river and if something is not done to prevent this menace of waste of land there is going to be a sad reckoning day not so far in the future and one of the best ways to prevent this occurrence is by terracing the land.

Terracing in this county will have a two-fold benefit. As has been explained in the above paragraph, the relation of terracing to soil erosion is one phase and I know of no better way of illustrating the other phase the benefit of terracing from the standpoint of conserving the soil moisture than by having you compare the yields of terraced and unterraced farms this past year.

The County Agent earnestly solicits the presence of all farmers and business men of the county at this demonstration because these men are very competent in their line of work and he should be able to give you some valuable pointers on the subject of terracing.

Don't forget the date, Monday Feb. 25th. And the place, S. A. Bowden farm one mile east of Munday.

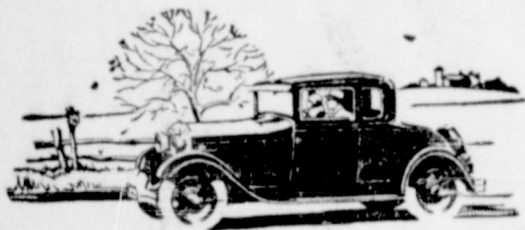

Fuel system of the new Ford has been designed for reliability and long service



The practical value of Ford simplicity of design is especially apparent in the fuel system.

The gasoline tank is built integral with the cowl and is unusually sturdy because it is made of heavy sheet steel, flame plated to prevent rust or corrosion. 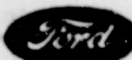
