Texans interested in temperarshould vote against the State liquor amendment firs on teh list of six constitutional changes which will be submitted to the voters in the November general electon

The amendment would make buone change in the present method of liquor distribution.

t woul give the State government the exclusive right to handle hard liquors such as whiskey, gin and rum Beer and wines, which are made with out distillation, would continue to be distributed through private agencies. There is no reason for putting the state in he liquor business and many ressons for keeping it out of it.

1.00 To set up a Stae Liquor monoply 80 ould mean creation of a vast new 1.00 government agnecy with an army of 1.Jv employees. These employees would re-1.00 side in every city, town and hamlet. 1.00 Such an organization could be built into the most powerful politicial ma-

Legalization of liquor, in Texas .50 and distribution through package . .50 stores has brought none of teh dire 50 politicial evils predicted during the repeal campaign.

Loquor interests have refrained from playing politics. No temptation in this direction should be set up by forcing the State government to act as sales agent in distribution of their 50 product.
