

Old Clock Keeps Perfect Time

Among other old things of interest hich are being unearthed in and about Knox City for the exhibit at the county celebration next Wednesuay is numbered a very old clock in the perses ion of Mr. W. J Jones. This old clock is known to be at least fifty years of age.

The clock was received by Jones in payment of a debt shortly after his marriage some forty six store in Purden Texas. Because of its receipt second-handed, it is impossible to determine accurately its exact origin or age. Suffice it to say that during the entire length of time it has been in his possession it has been a perfect timekeepr and not once during that period has it been nec essary to send it to a shop for nev parts or repair. It strike every half nour and must be wound only one each week. On occassions it has been left for two weeks without being wound and has not stopped running.

An interesting feature of the clock is its calendar hand which works as accurately as either its minute or hour hand. Running on the basis of hirty-one days, the only time necessary to move it forward is at the nd of those months of a shorter duration of time. This hand moves forward each night promptly on the stroke of midnight.

This clock has been in Knox County for the past thirty-one years having been removed here at the same time Mr. Jones came to the town to make Knox County his home.


