TIME TO INCREASE ADVERTISING RIGHT NOW. SAYS GAS MAN

"Right now—today—is the time to increase your advertising," James M. Bennett of Philadelphia, chairman of the advertising section of the American Gas Association, in a recent address before that organization.

"As I see it, advertise and your business succeeds. Stop advertising and your business declines. The first reaction of the average executive with the approach of hard times is to cut down on advertising. That this is, in the long-run, a short-sighted policy, is amply evidenced by the experience of large national advertisers during the last depression period of 1920.

"Charts showing their relative advertising expenditures and sales during 1920 and the five years following

indicated that those advertisers who steadily but conservatively increased their advertising during 1920 and the five years following were awarded with a consistent and proportionate increase in sales, while those who decreased their advertising showed and exactly proportionate decrease in sales for 1929 and the next five years."

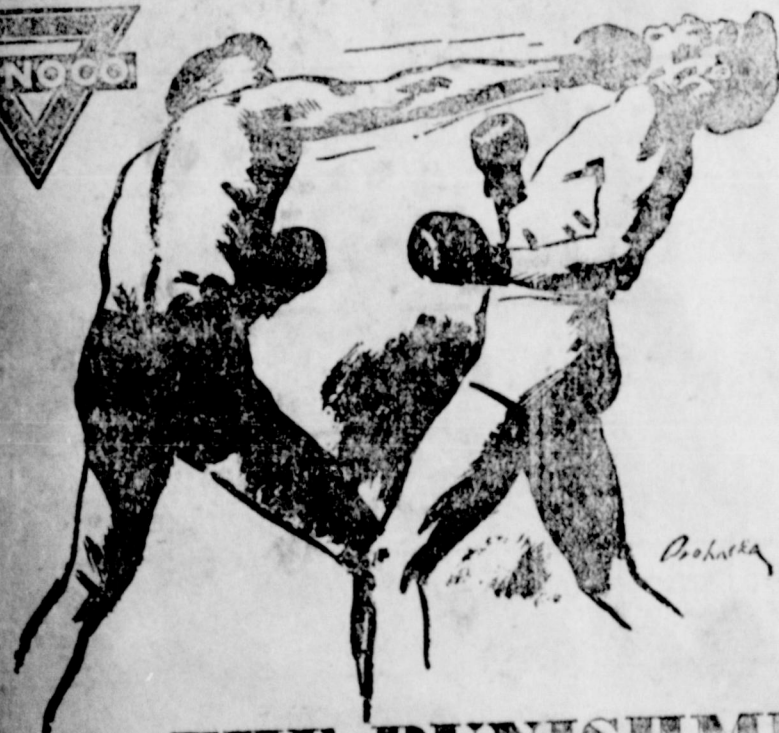

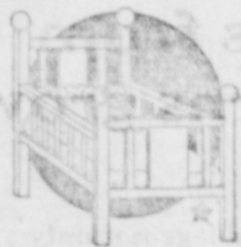
