Former Resident Injured, Wife And Daughter Killed

Wayne L. Darr, 47, a former resident now living in Fort Worth, remains in critical condition in Harris Hospital in Fort Worth following a two-car accident which claimed the lives of his wife and daughter.

The collision occurred about 11:50 p. m. Saturday, July 10, at the intersection of Boswell Road and FM 1220 and injured the driver of the other vehicle, Thomas Wiggs, 22, also of Fort Worth.

Mrs. Darr, 45, the former Earline Darden who was also

a former Knox City resident, and their 12-year-old daughter, Kimberly, were dead on arrival at the hospital shortly after the accident occurred.

According to Wayne's sister, Mrs. Milton (Ruth) Reeves, the family had been on a day's outing at Eagle Mountain Lake and were returning home when they apparently were side-swiped by the other car. Their car overturned, pinning both Wayne and his wife underneath. Kimberly was thrown from the car, Mrs. Reeves reported.

Mr. and Mrs. Reeves accompanied her brother and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Carl Darr of Paducah, to Fort Worth immediately after receiving word of the tragedy.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday, July 13, at 10:00 a. m. in Greenwood Chapel in Fort Worth for both Mrs. Darr and Kimberly, and burial was Wednesday, July 14, at Resthaven Cemetery in Lubbock.

Mrs. Darr's survivors include her husband, Wayne; a daughter, Mrs. Dianne Calzar Coria of Fort Worth; her mother, Mrs. Dewey Darden of Lubbock, and a sister, Mrs. Glenn W. Huntsman, also of Fort Worth.

As of press time Tuesday afternoon, Wayne was reported to be showing some improvement.

One senior girl from the 14 to 19 age group will be chosen to compete in the District Dress

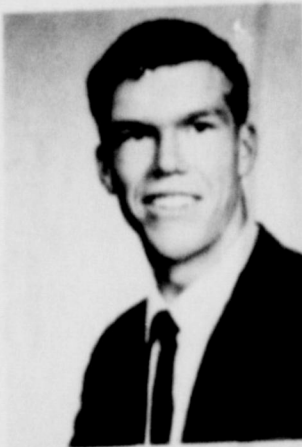

Venezulean Equine Encephalomyelitis (VEE) Vaccination
Federal interstate regulations REQUIRE that all equine originating in Texas must be accompanied by a certificate with TC-83 vaccine, according to county agent Herman K. Collier. The certificate must show the vaccine has been administered at least 14 days prior to movement.

The quarantine restricts equines to premises, except through arrangements made with your veterinarian for community or county collecting locations for vaccination then returned to their premises for the 14 day duration.

The quarantine is imposed on all movements or transportation of horses, mules, jacks, ponies and other equine animals within Texas.

The quarantine will remain in effect until further notice. Owners of one or more equine animals are to make sure they are vaccinated.
