## Former Resident Injured, Wife And Daughter Killed

Wayne L. Darr, 47, a former resident now living in Fort Worth, remains in critical condition in Harris Hospital in Fort Worth following a two-car accident which claimed the lives of his wife and daughter.

The collision occurred about 11:50 p.m. Saturday, July 10, at the intersection of Boswell Road and FM 1220 and injured the driver of the other vehicle, Thomas Wiggs, 22, also of Fort Worth.

Mrs. Darr, 48, the former Earline Darden who was also

a former Knox City resident, and their 12-year-old daughter, Kimberly, were dead on arrival at the hospital shortly after the accident occurred.

According to Wayne's sister, Mrs. Milton (Ruth) Reeves, the family had been on a day's outing at Eagle Mountain Lake

and were returning home when they apparently were sideswiped by the other car. Their car overturned, pinning both Wayne and his wife underneath. Kimberly was thrown from the car, Mrs. Reeves

reported.

Mr. and Mrs. Reeves accompanied her brother and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Carl Darr of Paducah, to Fort Worth immediately after receiving word of the tragedy.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday, July 13, at 10:00 a.m. in Greenwood Chapel in Fort Worth for both Mrs. Darr and Kimberly, and burial was Wednesday, July 14, at Resthaven Cemetery in Lubbock.

Mrs. Darr's survivors include her husband, Wayne; a daughter, Mrs. Dianne Catarina Corra of Fort Worth; her mother, Mrs. Dewey Darden of Lubbock, and a sister, Mrs. Glenn W. Huntsman, also of Fort Worth.

As of press time Tuesday afternoon, Wayne was reported to be showing some improvement.


