

The Wichita County Crippled Children's Committee is sponsoring a free clinic for the examination of crippled and

deformed children, to be held in Wichita Falis on Thursday, December 7. Surgeons from the Medical staff of the Crippied Children's Division, and local physicians from Wichita Falls, families are not able to provide

such care as is needed. The Clinic will be held at the First Methodist church, corner of Tenth and Travis screets. Registration will begin at eight o'clock in the morning, and the child has been examined by members of the Medical Staff. GOREE BOBCATS No treatment of the children will be given at the church during the day, but parents will be told what may be expected from treatment of children if hospitalization is recommended. All parents with crippled or deformed children under 21 years of age are invited to bring them to the clinic for an examination. Where children, have already been hospitalized, it will be possible for them to receive a check-up of their con-

dition during the day. The fol-lowing counties are included in the area to be served by this clinic: King, Cottle, Wilbarger, Childress, Knox, Hardeman Feurd, Stonewail, Throckmor ton, Haskell, Young, Jack, Archer, Clay and Montague.

The work of the State Crippled Childrens Division is limited to cases of orthopedic and plastic surgery, and hospitalization is provided for mentally normal children under 11 years of age, whose parents are not able to provide the needed Austin, Hon.
