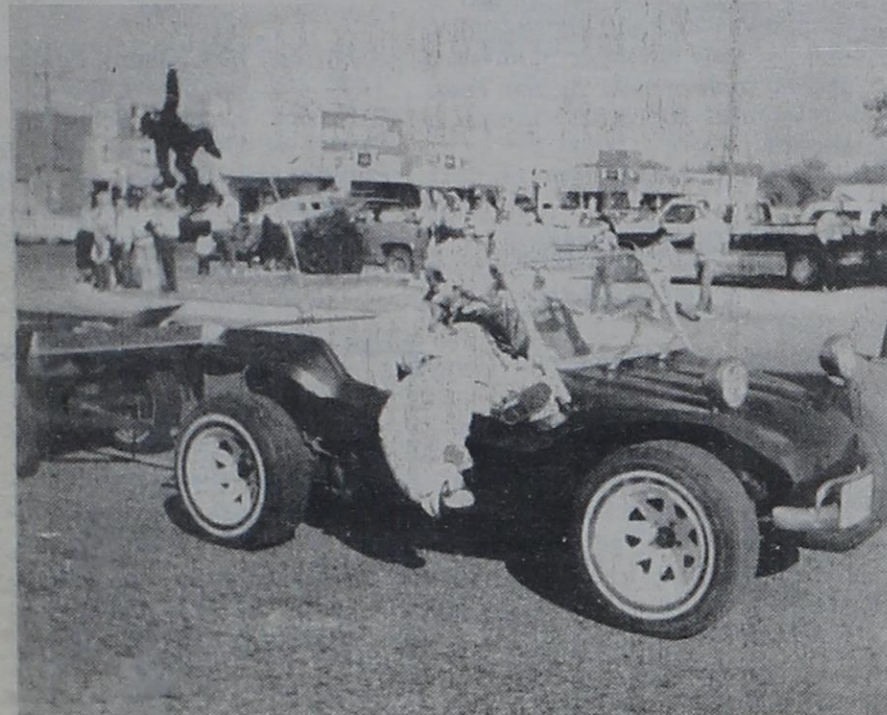

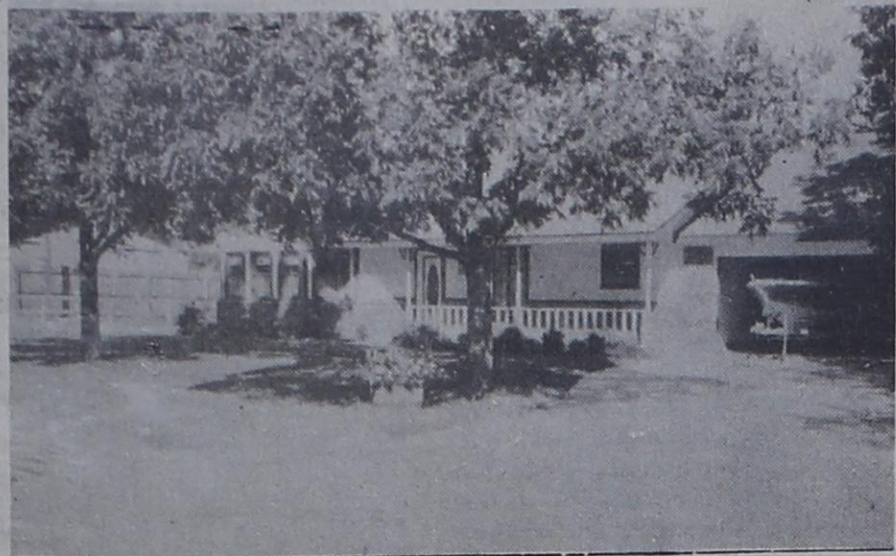

Coach Cliff Gilmore was satisfied with his young team's performance, commenting that they did a good job in spite of the Jaguar victory.

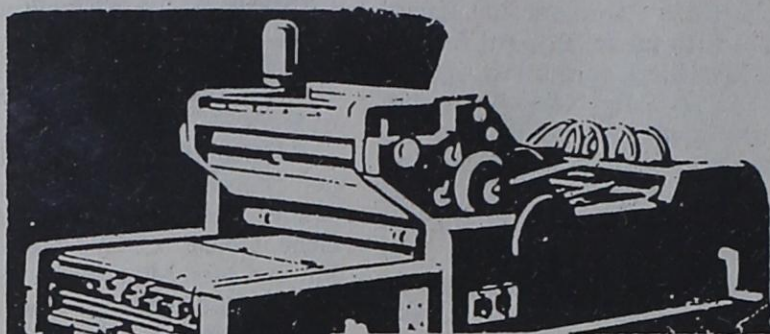

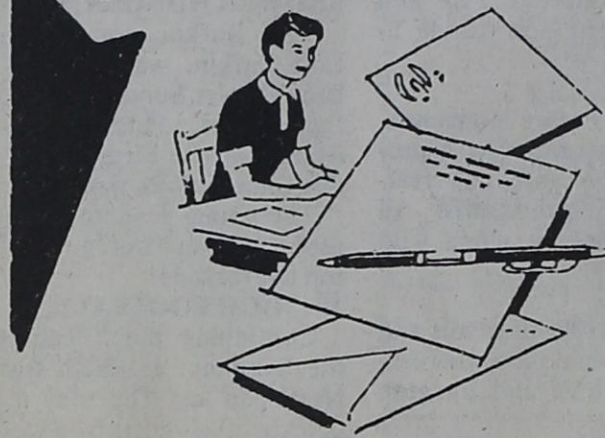
