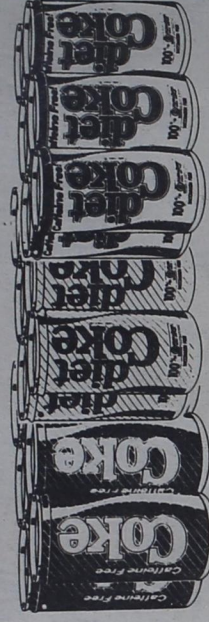

**Baker Named Temporary Hospital Administrator**

Knox County Hospital District trustee W.R. 'Bill' Baker was named hospital administrator pro-tem at a meeting held March 31. Members attending the meeting were Baker, Ray Lynn Hardin, Bernard Brown, Maurine Reeder, Benny Grill and Greg Clonts. Vernal Zeissel was absent. Also present were Don Bunton, Dr. Dale Selzer and Gary Schur of Munday.

Minutes of the March 12 meeting were read and approved. Clonts called for opening of bids for reroofing the main hospital building. It was noted that the hospital district had advertised for bids and provided a specification list and project requirements.

Bids and/or alternative proposals were received from Barr Roofing Co. and Lydick-Hooks Roofing Co., both of Abilene, Unlimited Resources, Inc., of Alvin and New Shield Roofing Systems of Spur. Doug Blackburn, a representative for the latter company, was present to give explanations of his alternative proposal. No board action was taken, and it was agreed that reroofing considerations would be a future agenda item.

Bunton, Schur and Dr. Selzer talked to the board about efforts to secure the services of a physician in Munday. They reassured the board of their continuing support for the Knox County Hospital.

It was decided to ask one applicant for administrator to come in

for a personal interview at the next meeting. The board discussed the need to carry out routine administrative functions on a full time basis and until such time that the services of a full time administrator can be obtained. It was suggested that a board member representative could carry out these responsibilities, and trustee W.R. Baker volunteered to function in this capacity in the near term with the understanding that the board will actively continue to secure the services of an administrator or administrative group.

A motion was made by Bernard Brown and seconded by Ray Lynn Hardin that Baker be named Knox County Hospital District administrator pro-tem without compensation and with authority to represent the board and the district in matters that can normally be delegated to the administrator. The matter carried by unanimous vote.

Baker then moved to pay the accounts payable in the amount of \$2,765.78. Grill seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Consideration of employee benefits was next on the agenda. Mrs. Reeder moved to pay these benefits, and Brown seconded the motion, which carried unanimously. No action was taken after a discussion of accounts receivable and legal remedies.

The meeting adjourned at 10:30 p.m.

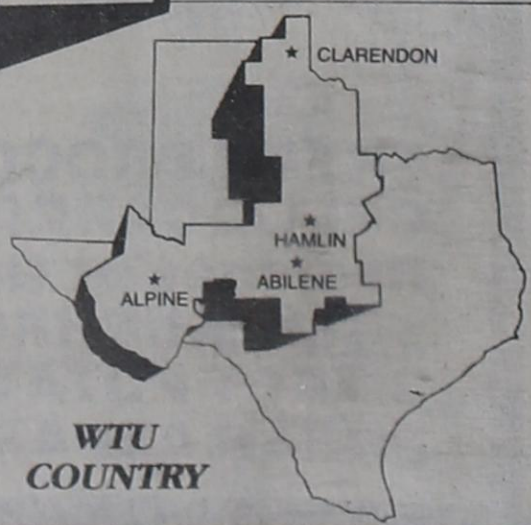
