**Mighty Moguls win!  
Hawley defeated 23 - 6**

*Coach Gunter looks for consistency on offense this week against Archer City*

The Munday Moguls shook off a slow start here in Hawley last Friday night and allowed their improving defense to take over and dominate the football game in this non-district contest. The Mogul defense held the Bearcats to a total of 74 yards, 45 rushing and 29 by air, while the Munday offense led by half-back Jason Key rolled up a total of 258 yards, 171 on the ground in 48 attempts and 87 total yards passing.

Jason Key was the leading rusher for the Moguls with 87 yards on 16 carries and one touchdown, followed by Brian Urbanczyk who had 70 yards rushing on 20 carries. The Sophomore half-back also caught one pass for 26 yards and a touchdown.

Rounding out the rushing totals, Eric Beaty rushed for 12 yards following a bad snap on a punt attempt. Ramiro Nunez rushed for 8, and quarter-back Brandon Sosa had a total of 4 yards rushing.

In the passing department Munday, led by Brandon Sosa completed 5 passes in 14 attempts for a total of 87 yards and one touchdown. Wesley Spells led the way for the Mogul receivers with 33 yards and 2 receptions, followed by Eric Beaty also with 2 catches for 28 yards and Brian Urbanczyk who had 1 catch for 26 yards which resulted in a Mogul touchdown with 1:33 left in the first half.

Munday won the toss and elected to receive and after advancing the kickoff to their own 25 yard line, failed to get a first down on the opening drive and had to punt. Beaty hit a boomer for 46 yards putting the ball on the Bearcat 28.

Hawley then proceeded to dismantle the sleeping Mogul defense racking up all of their yardage for the night and scoring their lone touchdown while converting 4 fourth down attempts in a drive that ate up all but 3 minutes of the first quarter.

Munday's offense started rolling up the yardage in the second and the defense found their edge over-

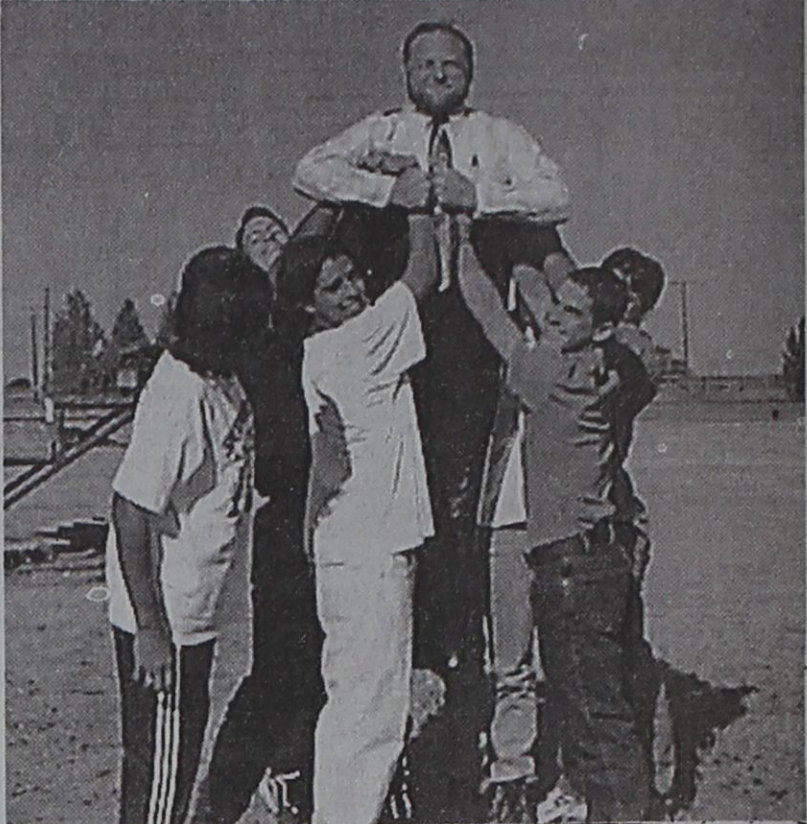

coming two big special team penalties, one roughing the kicker on a punt and the other an illegal block on a punt return, and the Moguls took charge of the game.

Jason Key scored on a 7 yard run to tie the score and Brian Urbanczyk put the Moguls ahead for good with his 26 yard touchdown reception of a Brandon Sosa pass. Key's Kick was good to make the score Munday 13 and Hawley 6 at half-time.

The third quarter was a defensive see-saw battle with Munday unable to connect on some key offensive opportunities. Eric Beaty sparked the misfiring offense with his quick thinking advance of a bad snap on a punt attempt for 12 yards and a Munday first down.

Munday failed to convert early in the fourth quarter on a fourth and three situation when Urbanczyk fumbled and Key recovered and advanced for what would have been first down yardage however the ruling was that only the back fumbling could advance the football. Hawley took over on downs and fumbled on the first play giving the ball back to the Moguls at the Bearcat 40. Munday drove the ball to the Bearcat 15 where the drive stalled and Jason Key hit a 34 yard field goal to make the score Munday 16 Hawley 6.

Munday's blitzing defense swarmed the Hawley quarterback sacking him twice on the combined efforts of Wesley Spells, Ramiro Nunez, and Michael Josselet for a total of -8 yards on the next series. It was all Urbanczyk and Key putting the cap on the offensive totals with Urbanczyk scoring from 1 yard out with 30 seconds left in the game. Once again Key's kick was good and the score was Munday 23 Hawley 6.

Eric Beaty intercepted the Bearcat quarterback to bring the game to a close as Sosa took the final snap and took a knee with 2 seconds left.

**Coach Gunter's Comments:** "I felt like we started out tentative on defense again this week. We really picked it up defensively after the 1st quarter and that was the key to our victory Friday night...I was very proud of our defense the last 3 quarters holding Hawley to no first downs. Offensively, we just were not consistent enough to keep drives going. We missed some big play opportunities we should have made that probably would have given us a couple of more scores. Overall, I was pleased with our effort because we were a lot more aggressive than we had been the last two weeks and it was nice to have all our players back practicing this past week. This week we face a much improved Archer City team with a 3 - 1 record. Archer City's only loss was to Albany last Friday 14 - 6 and Albany is 4 - 0. The wildcats of Archer City are lead offensively by Dustin Owens #20 a 6 ft. 191 lb. Sr. quarterback. He likes to throw the ball to split end #3 Steven Wuthrich 6' 4" 143 lbs. Wuthrich has made a lot of big plays for them. We must contain their quarterback and split end if we are to be successful on defense this week. Defensively, they are very aggressive with multiple fronts. They have allowed only 14 points all year long. Their defense provides a big test for our offense. Game time for this Homecoming contest is 7:30 pm Saturday, October, 3rd. Jr. High and JV will play in Archer City Thursday starting at 4:30 pm with the 7th followed by the 8th and the JV."

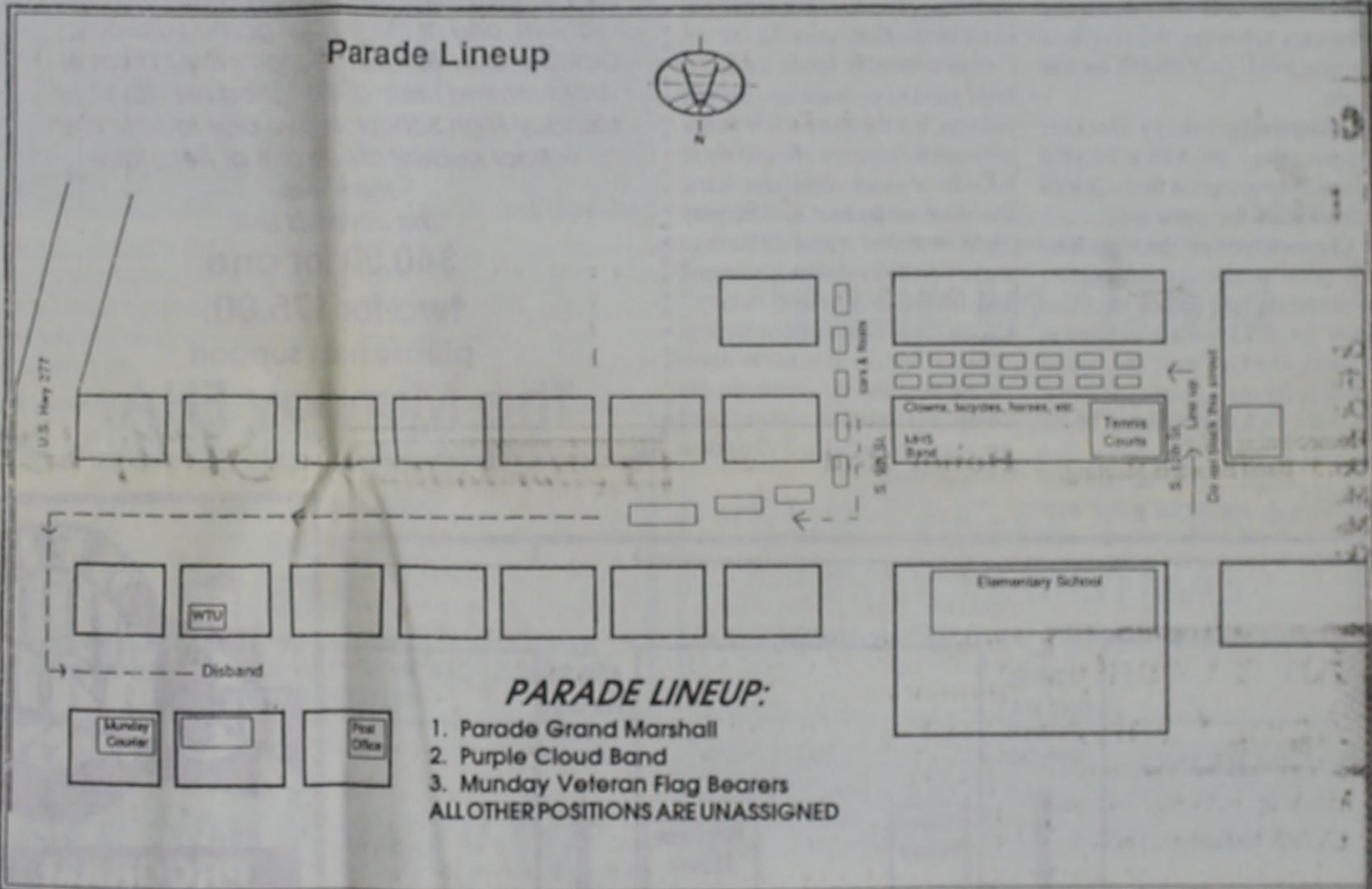

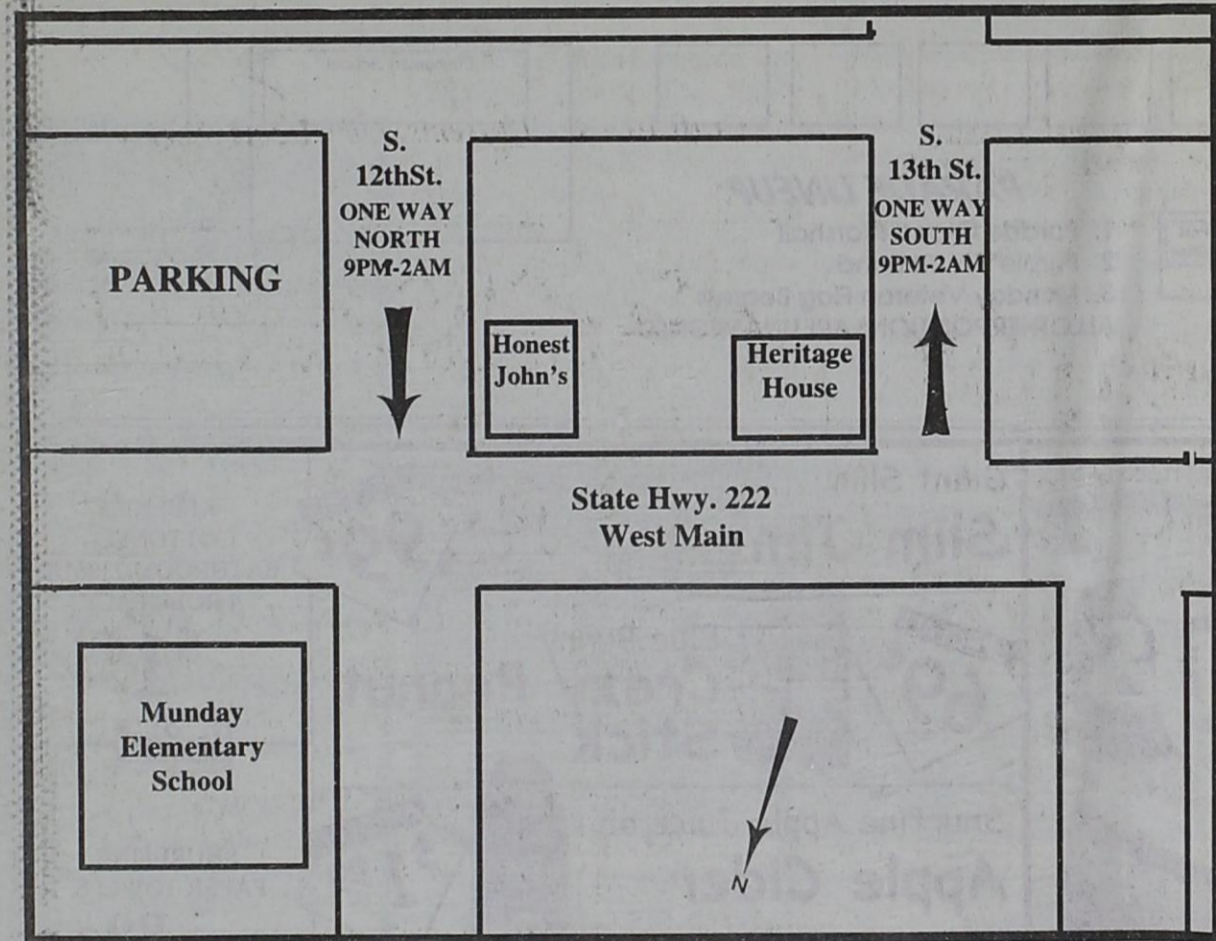

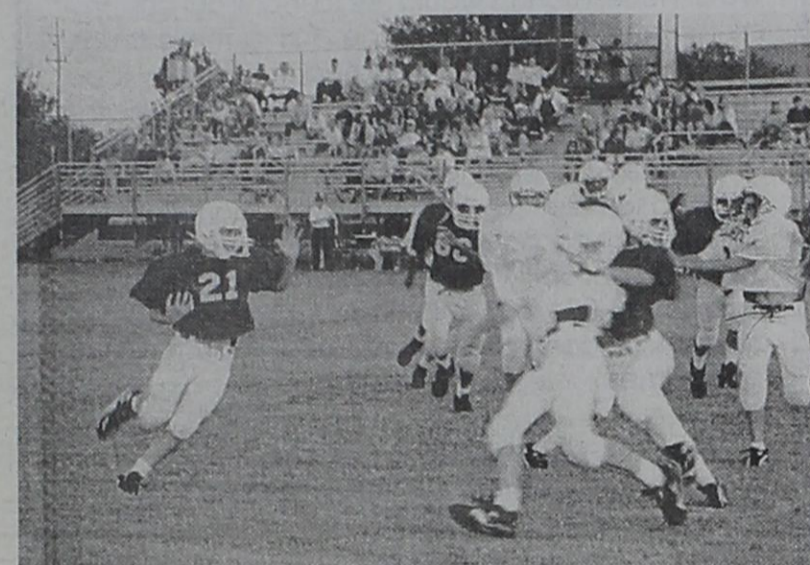


## Eighth Grade Braves show skills in Hawley defeat
