City And School Board Positions Up For Votes

The City of Munday and the Munday Independent School District will be searching for a few good men and women to fill vacancies on the City Council and the School Board of Trustees.

The Munday Independent School District will be seeking to fill three terms for three years each. The terms of Maynard Moore, Gary Mizer, and Mike Stewart will all be expiring. There will also be a 1 year term to fill - that is the seat vacated by David Key which Bobby Sosolik was appointed to fill until the May election. The first day candidates may file for intent to run for these positions is February 21 and the last day to file

is March 22. The election is May 6. Candidates may file their intent to run at the Superintendent's office Monday through Friday from 8:00 - 4:00. There is no filing fee.

The City of Munday will need to fill the seats of two council members and also the Mayor's position. The terms of council members Judy Lowe and Winters Matthews will be expiring, along with Gary Tidwell's position as Mayor. All of these positions are two year terms. Filing begins February 21 and lasts until March 22. Early voting begins April 19 and ends May 2 with election day being May 6. No filing fee is required.

The Mogulettes will now face a tough Crowell team on Tuesday night. The first game of the playoffs will take place in Vernon at 7:30. The Crowell girls are the champions of their district.

Meanwhile the Moguls easily took the district championship on Tuesday night after they battled the Petrolia Pirates and came out victorious. The Moguls handed Petrolia their second district loss by the score of 60 to 43 in a workman like performance from the solid Munday team. Munday had three shooters in double figures, Robert Dockins with 16, B. J. Brown and Lane Murphy both with 12, followed by Eric Beaty with 9, Alan Albus with 6, Brian Urbanczyk with 4, and Jason Key with 3.

All of Lane Murphy's points came from three point range as Murphy got the start over an ailing Jason Key.

The opening game of the playoffs for the Moguls is yet to be determined however they are scheduled for a warm-up game this Friday night with Hale Center. The game will take place at Motley County High School at 7:30.

In other Munday High School basketball action on Tuesday evening the Junior Varsity girls took down Petrolia's junior varsity by a score of 40 - 32. Laurie Welch led the scoring for the Mogulette JV with 13 followed by Jenny Ramirez with 9, Krisi Harlan with 8, and Kylie Myers with 6. Cassie Gulley, Jennifer Hernandez, and Jenny Carlson all had 2 points to round out the scoring for the Mogulette JV.

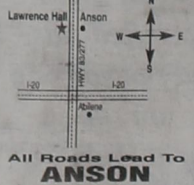

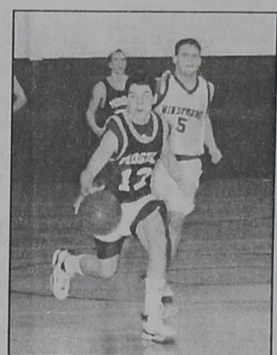

Munday High School Powerlifters are meeting the competition head on and fared well at a January 29th meet in Childress.

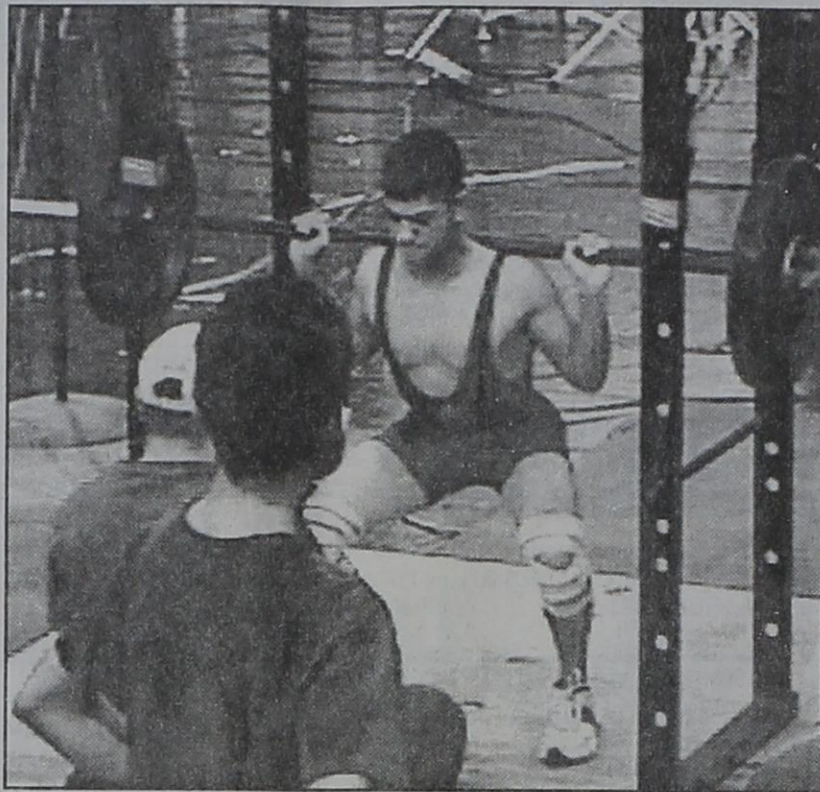

squatted 380 pounds, benched 210 pounds and dead lifted 330 pounds.

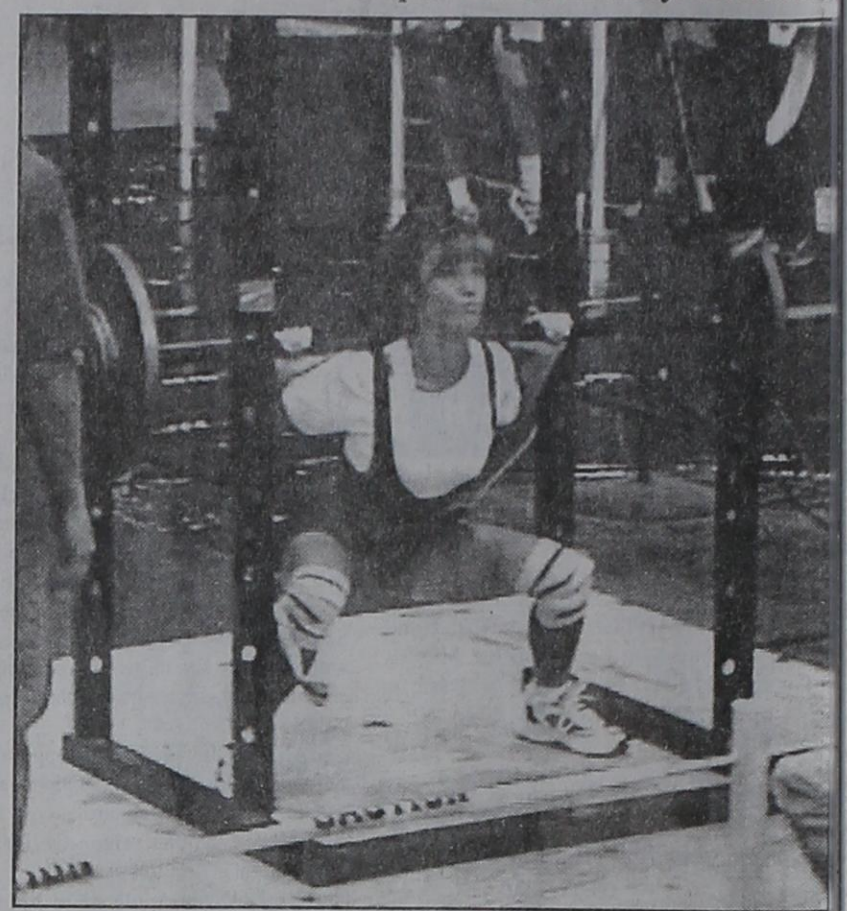
