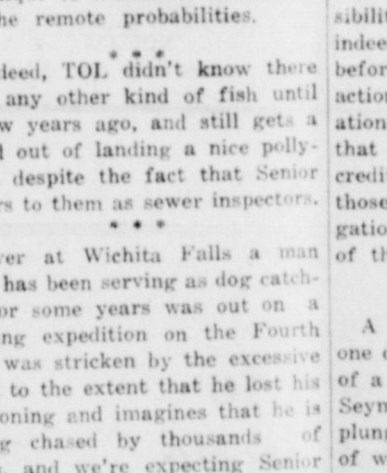

Body, Not Baton, Best As Conductor, Is Claim

Charles Previn Discards Conventional Method for New

New York City—Dean of a new school of orchestra leadership which has discarded the old baton is Charles Previn, well-known conductor of the Camel Pleasure Hour Orchestra. Instead of a baton, Mr. Previn uses his entire body to guide his orchestra. Even the ripple of his trousers leg means something quite definite to his men. So much the way he shakes a shoulder or tosses his shock of hair. Sometimes every inch of his body is engaged at once in his unusual mode of conducting. "Since I cannot be seen by radio audience," says Mr. Previn, "I hope that I am absolved from any suspicion of conducting as I do just to try to be different or bizarre. As a matter of fact, it is now many years since I have used a baton. I discovered early in my study that musical vibrations set up certain motions in a sensitive director and these motions were the only method that

themselves. The relief of agriculture, meaning the farming families, continues a grave problem yet to be solved. Back of the distress, and worse than anything else, is the fate of millions of American children, horribly punished in an economic vice that maintains its hideous grip. Knox county farmers have been blessed, perhaps, above the average, but the thought strikes us that something ought to be done locally to answer the gravest challenge of the present century.

WE WILL KNOW IT

Ever since the present depression began the public has been treated to constant predictions that the end was just around the corner and now it is hearing very often that the upgrade has come and that business has already started back to a more prosperous condition. Quite naturally, the average person takes these optimistic statements with some suspicion. The a. p. knows full well that when prosperity returns he will know it just about as surely as the big business prophets. There will be no need for spreading the news of the event for it will make itself evident in an unmistakable way.

WONDERFUL ACHIEVEMENT.

When Wiley Post and Harold Gatty set their white monoplane on the ground at Roosevelt Field they marked a new epoch in flying. Hereafter, no mere crossing of the Atlantic, or even Pacific, ocean will suffice to gain the interest of the world. New records in round-the-world trips are the vogue! While the flyers did not go around the 25,000-mile girth of this old planet, they did make a 15,474 mile journey in 4 days, 19 hours flying time, averaging 154 miles per hour. Altogether, they were away from New York only 8 days, 15 hours, 51 minutes, and this time could have been reduced if both men had been able to fly their plane. The flight was dramatic and remarkable, keeping the world on pins as people watched the progress of the great aviators.

AN UNUSUAL MAN

A few days ago Dr. Stephen M. Babcock, famous scientist, died at

the age of eighty-seven. In 1890 he announced to the world his famous test by which the butterfat value of milk could be determined.

What we want to call especial attention to is the lack of mercenary motive in this scientist for when he perfected his discovery, which would have made him a fortune in dollars he made it public with the announcement, "it is not patented."

It is refreshing to run across the record of such a life. Here was a man interested in his science and the possibility of helping mankind.

HERE'S A GOOD PARDON

Gov. Pollard, of Virginia, gives an exhibition of good judgment and sound common sense by issuing a pardon to Jesse Strawderman, of Youngtown, Ohio. The facts, it seems, are that, as a youth he was sentenced to serve a sentence of one year, but escaped. He settled in Ohio and lived the life of a good citizen for twelve years. He voluntarily returned to Virginia to clear-up the episode. As Governor Pollard says it was "not necessary to further confine this man either for the protection of the public or the benefit of the individual."

How often do we lose sight of the reasons, stated above, which alone justify penal punishment?

R. L. Henry, Former Congressman, Is Victim of Accident

Houston, July 9.—Former Congressman R. L. Henry, 57, died today of a bullet wound in the head. He was found wounded this morning and a pistol was found nearby, in his home.

Mr. Henry, who campaigned successfully in the last senatorial election for the Democratic nomination to the United States Senate, for many years was congressman from the 11th district, which includes Waco.

A pistol with one bullet discharged was found on the floor beside the wounded lawyer.

Showing Accidental

Dr. M. L. Graves, the family physician, said the shooting was accidental.

The bullet entered the right temple and ranged upward in the head.

Mr. Henry was defeated several years ago for re-election to Congress by Tom Connally of Martin, who now is the junior United States senator from Texas.

Henry took an active part in the Alvin K. Smith campaign in Texas in 1928. His unsuccessful senatorial campaign was based largely upon the contention that a change was needed in the national prohibition laws.

Mr. Henry was appointed an assistant attorney general under the late former Governor Calhoun and later ran for the office of attorney general, but was defeated.

He removed to Waco and in 1906 was elected congressman from the 11th district.

The many friends of the Rev. R. H. Freeman will regret to learn that he is critically ill at his home in Abilene with tuberculosis, having been forced some months ago to give up his pastorate at Littlefield, and, learning of his condition his friends here recently remembered the family with a liberal pouring.
