### Courthouse Of King County To Get Medallion

A Texas Historical Building Medallion has been awarded for the King County Courthouse at Guthrie. The announcement was made by Mr. Tom Medders of Wichita Falls, member of the Texas State Historical Survey Committee.

The Medallion is awarded for structures of historical, architectural or cultural significance to the area in which they exist. The Courthouse is one of the older buildings of King County.

Since the Historical Building Medallion program was inaugurated in March of this year, over 185 structures have been found worthy of Medallions. This is the first award for King County.

The Medallion is made of cast aluminum with Swedish Steel effect. Red, white and blue stars and the words, "State Historical Survey Committee" encircle a raised map of Texas.

The Medallion will be presented in Amarillo on August 18. This is the meeting of County Historical Survey Committees of the Panhandle-South Plains area, sponsored by the Texas State Historical Survey Committee.

Making the presentation will be Senator Culp Krueger of El Campo, acting Lieutenant Governor of Texas. Also appearing on the program will be Senator Grady Hazelwood of Amarillo, the Honorable Tom Taylor, Travel and Information Director of the Texas Highway Department and Dr. Rupert N. Richardson, president of the Texas State Historical Survey Committee.

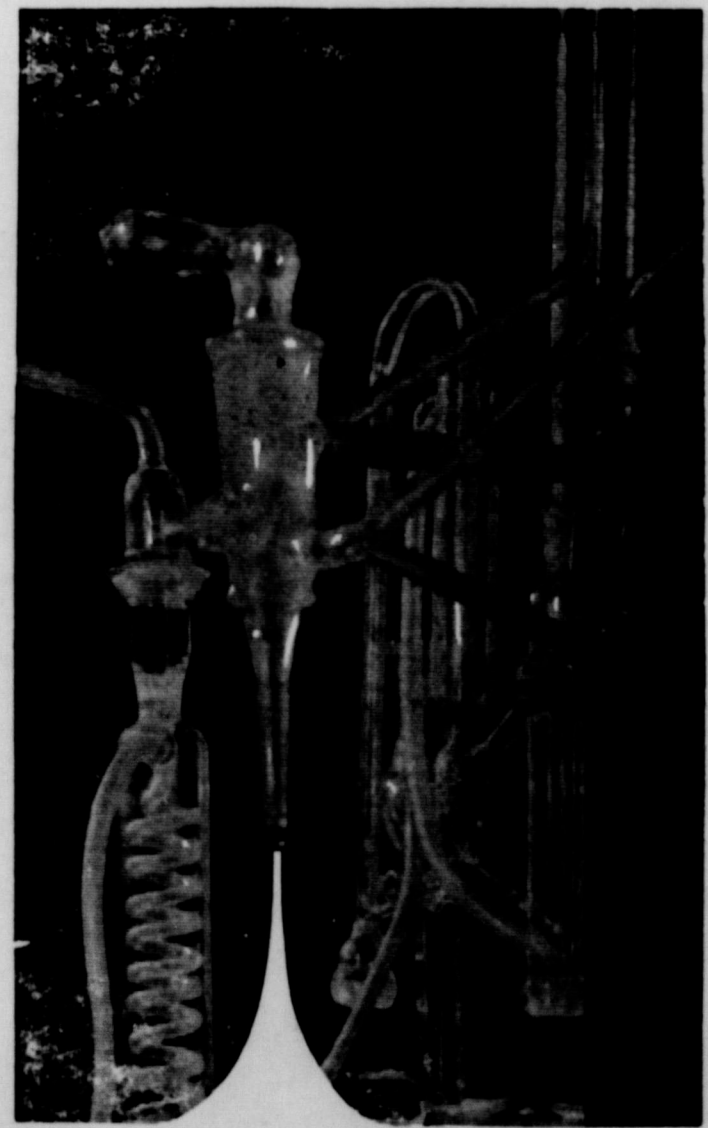

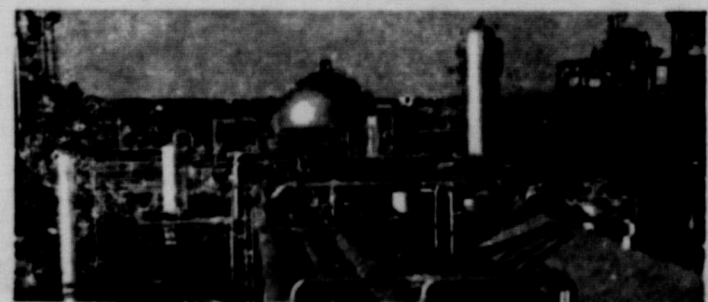

### Farmers Need Good Farm Records

There are many cases each year where a farmer's monthly social security benefits are delayed because he has not kept good farm records, Erton F. Tate, District Manager, Wichita Falls Social Security Office, said today.

Complete and accurate records are necessary not only for good farm management but for getting proper and continuous protection for social security benefits as well, he said.

Tate explained that farm operators are required to make accurate reports of wages for their hired hands and to report their own earnings to the Internal Revenue Service for social security purposes. Good farm records assure prompt and accurate payments of social security payments to the farmer he said.

These records do not have to be elaborate, Tate added, but they should show the various types of farm income and expenses.

Information on becoming eligible for social security benefits may be obtained from the Wichita Falls Social Security Office, 411 Federal Building, Wichita Falls, Texas.
