Most Munday Merchants Will Close Tuesday and Wednesday Of Next Week

Practically all of Munday's merchants will be closed for two days—Tuesday and Wednesday—for the Christmas holidays. This is the period for closing voted on earlier in the year in a poll taken by the Munday Chamber of Commerce.

There are some exceptions, however. Some will be closed longer, while a few will be open on December 26.

The tailoring firms in Munday—King's Drive-in Cleaners and Sunlite Cleaners—announced last week that they will be closed from Saturday night through Wednesday.

Officers of the Stamford Production Credit Association have announced that the Munday office will also be closed Monday through Wednesday.

Jeff Mitchell of the City Grill stated Monday that this firm will be closed for one week so the management and employees might have a short vacation during the holiday period.

GIVE TO THE BLOOD BANKS

Blood banking in disasters, progress in the search for a reliable test for hepatitis, and a new process that promises longer preservation of blood were among the subjects of 80 papers presented at the recent annual meeting of the American Association of Blood Banks.

This year is the 25th anniversary of blood banking and in this time blood transfusion has grown from a few hundred pints to more than five million a year.

The Association is an organization of non-profit hospital and community banks whose blood is virtually all donated and many of whose workers are unpaid volunteers.

The Association has established standards for blood banks, has a national blood clearing-house system, regional reference laboratories and maintains a central file for rare donors. Since May 27, 1961 clearinghouses of the Association and Red Cross have cooperated to permit local donations of blood for credit anywhere in the country.

The Association maintains frozen storage of rare donor blood with the cooperation of many hospitals. Usually, rare type blood frozen under the AABB program is donated by the participating blood banks to be made available for all patients in cases where compatible blood cannot be obtained in any other way.

Dr. Bernard Fantus established the world's first blood bank at Cook County Hospital in Chicago in 1937. Your contribution to a blood bank may save a life.

Farm and Ranch magazine says: "There are an estimated 36 per cent fewer farms, 20 per cent fewer people on them, now compared to 1954. But it isn't the successful farmer who has headed for town. Those who have stayed on the farm are buying more than ever before. The per-capita income, as well as farm expenditures, is at an all-time high. Value of land and buildings is up 81.6 per cent."

NEATEST TRICK SINCE HOUDINI

Top officials of the government are now planning to perform the neatest trick since Houdini developed his amazing illusions—to tax less and at the same time spend more.

This scheme, let it be noted, comes at a time when we are running a fiscal year deficit of close to \$8 billion, and when the federal government's increases in tax revenues are substantially below its increases in expenditures.

The pending jumps in spending will, if Congress should be so foolish as to authorize them, be largely and perhaps wholly in welfare state projects. Then, in all probability, the weary old cycle would start again. There would be a wave of inflation, a further cheapening of the dollar which is now worth less than half of what it was before World War II, new wage demands supported by strikes in the major industries, and increased living costs of every kind. The Soviets, who hope this country will collapse from internal economic disturbance, could hardly ask for more.

PENSION CRAZY

An Associated Press news dispatch reports that the ambition of Britain's male high school seniors is a nice safe job with a pension at retirement. A London headmaster who has made a study of the situation concludes, "Nobody wants to be at the top of anything." He was discouraged to find that not a single boy wanted to be prime minister, admiral of the fleet, field marshal, ambassador to the United States, archbishop of Canterbury or head of the Bank of England. "Instead," he said, "the boys look forward to becoming clerks, manual workers, draughtsmen and half-dressers . . . We are turning out hordes of premature pensioners of life." The headmaster based his findings on questionnaires the boys had turned in to government employment officers.

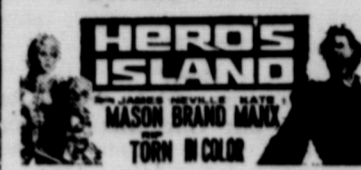

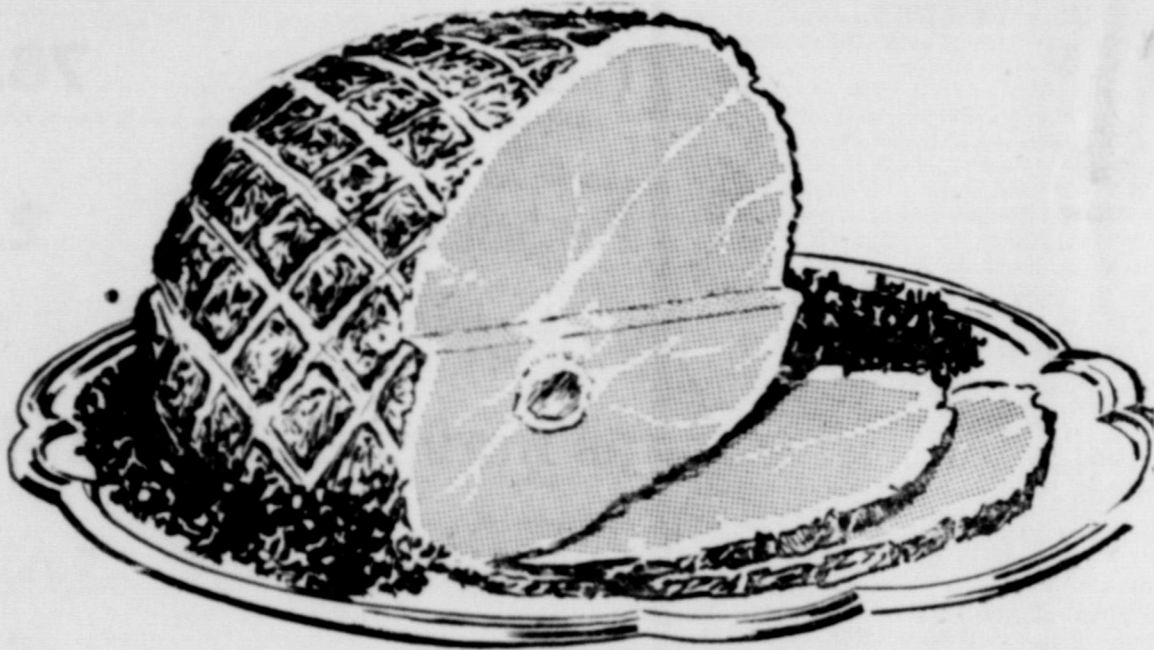

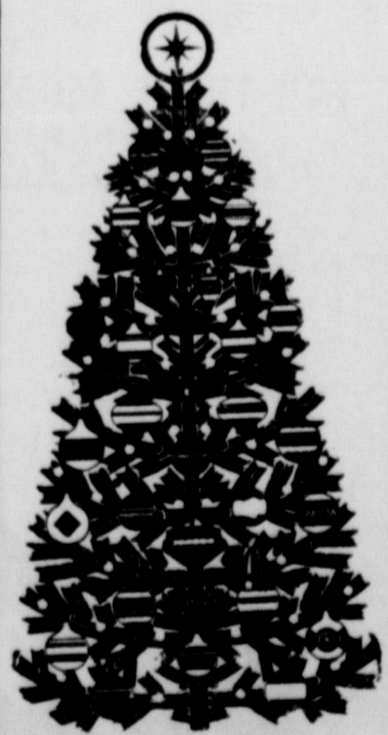

A total of about 277,000 cattle were fed out in 1955, 548,000 in 1961, and close to 700,000 will be fed in 1962. Bergsma showed slides of cattle feeding lots in various parts of the state, and pointed out that this phase of the cattle industry was a great boost to the economy of our state.

12 Accidents Are Investigated In November

The Highway Patrol investigated twelve rural accidents in Knox County during the month of November according to Sergeant Frank Jirik, Patrol Supervisor of this area.

These wrecks accounted for one fatality, six persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$7,825.00.

The rural traffic accident summary for Knox County from January through November of 1962 shows a total of 55 crashes. As a result of these crashes there were two persons killed and 37 persons injured. The estimated property damage amounted to \$27,801.00.

Traffic wise, December is traditionally the most dangerous month of the year. Just what makes it so dangerous? It is a time of goodwill, cheer and celebration. Why should it be so dangerous?

The Sergeant stated there can be many reasons for this. The month of December has fewer hours of daylight than any other month. We usually have some bad weather. People insist on celebrating the holidays with intoxicating beverages. Many are preoccupied with holiday activities and do not apply their full attention to their driving and walking. There will be some traveling at excessive speed to reach their destination. Others will be fatigued because of not stopping for rest along the way.

"Facing the prospect of 92 traffic deaths during the holidays, our patrolmen will be working overtime hours, and they will remain especially alert for those serious law violations which are responsible for most fatal accidents — such as excessive speed and driving while drinking," he said.

"In other words, we will be doing everything within our power to prove the statistics, which are so often right, are wrong for the holiday season. And we trust that holiday motorists will help by heeding the traffic laws and rules of safety."

Weekly Health LETTER

Issued by the State Health Department

It is ironic that the Christmas season, despite the festive atmosphere, is among the most potentially hazardous times of the year. Most often the agents of tragedy are the very things intended to bring pleasure — the gifts, the lights and the gaily decorated tree.

But State Health Department

safety experts report most tragedy is avoidable when ordinary discretion is used in selecting presents and decorations.

Almost all young children tend to taste-test their toys. This is why the lead poisoning death rate among children of the United States is about 60 per year. Most manufacturers use safe paint on toys, but some still do not. Safely painted toys or children's furniture can be identified by the legend: "Conforms to American standard Z56.1—1955 for use on surfaces which might be chewed."

Some plastic toys are so flammable that the slightest contact with a lighted cigarette or match will set off a blaze. Certain types of plastic will burst into flame even at a distance from fire. Others may break with razor-sharp, jagged edges.

Most American toy manufacturers use unbreakable, non-flammable plastics, but lowest imports are not always so safe. It pays to be selective.

Manufacturers have been asked to cease making dolls and stuffed animals with eyes a toddler can pull off and swallow or stuff in his nose or ear. Meanwhile, mothers should remove such eyes and embroider new ones in their place.

Projectile-type toys such as pellet guns, darts, etc., inevitably cause their share of serious injury and deaths. It is mere common sense to accompany these gifts with strict enforcement of safety rules.

As for tree decorations, if the box doesn't say "flameproof" don't buy it. Use only decorative lighting carrying the Underwriters Laboratory tag of approval. And make it a habit to pull the power cord from the wall outlet when you leave home. This is important because insulation failures and overheated circuits can "pop" you long while you're away.

To keep the tree from drying out so quickly, try standing it in a pan of water throughout the holidays. Be sure to add water as it gets low. As an added precaution, take the tree down immediately after the holidays.
