## TxDot Schedules Meeting to Address plans to Widen U.S. 277

There will be a public hearing on a TXDOT proposal to widen the existing stretch of U.S. Highway 277 at 6:30 p.m. Thursday, June 8, 2000 at the Perry Patton Community Center 131 West Cisco Munday, Texas. Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) proposes to widen US 277 from two lanes to four lanes divided by a median. Additional right of way will be required. A schematic plan showing the improvements and the environmental assessment for the project will be available for viewing at the hearing. These documents will be available for inspection at TxDOT's Munday Area Office and the Childress District Office.

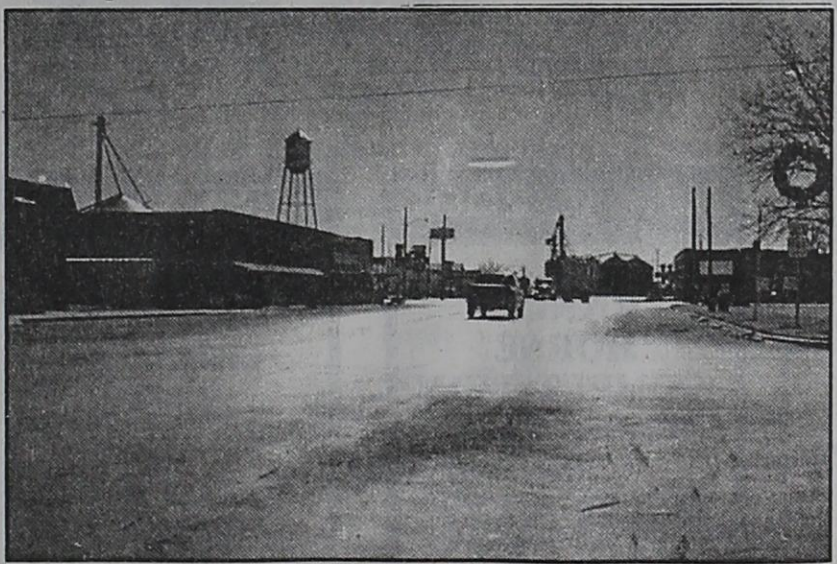
The existing right of way varies but is typically 100 feet. The proposed right of way varies from 100 feet to 400 feet. There is the potential for 4 businesses and 12 residential relocations. Information about the States Relocation Assistance Program, the benefits and services for displacements and information concerning the relocation assistance office, as well as information about the tentative schedule for right of way acquisition, can be obtained from the District right of way office in

Childress. There will be no wetland impacts associated with the roadway construction across the Mesquite Rolling Plains.

TxDot invites all interested citizens to attend this hearing. Comments may be presented at the hearing or in writing to David B. Casteel, Childress District Engineer, P.O. Box 900, Childress, Texas 79201, or Gary Mizer, Munday Area Engineer, P.O. Box 349, Munday TX 76371. Written comments will be received for 10 days following the meeting.

The public hearing will be conducted in English, and the community center is handicap accessible. Any request for language interpreters or other special needs should be made at least two days prior to the public hearing by contacting Barbara Seal, Public Information Officer at (940) 937-7145, or Gary Mizer, Area Engineer, at (940) 422-4115. TxDOT will make every reasonable effort to accommodate these needs.

Yard sales can be a worthwhile starting point for budding antique collectors. Many dealers routinely spend their week end mornings chasing around from sale to sale.

You probably already know, if you've been out "yard-sale-ing" even once, that the early bird really does get the fattest worm, sometimes the only worm. The question then is: Just how early is early?

A gentleman who decided to pare down some "leftovers" in his home was all set to open his own garage sale at 9:00 a.m. That morning he was trying to wake up with a cup of strong black coffee at 6:00 a.m. when two middle-aged women rapped on the kitchen window to get his attention, shouting, "Is this where the garage sale is?" as he frantically looked for someplace to hide his body since he was only clothed in his underwear!

He never quite recovered nor has he every attempted another garage sale! But those two women weren't doing themselves any favors, because while they hung around try-

ing to strong-arm him into opening his garage early another great yard sale was in full swing a few blocks away.

The point is - get there as early as possible, but don't become unpleasantly intrusive. Don't stretch the advertised "opening" time and if an ad says "no early birds," believe it!

If a sale isn't actually up and operating when you arrive, but the boxes are coming out of the house or garage, it's acceptable behavior to walk up and ask if they mind your looking as they work. Most often they won't. You might even volunteer to help bring out boxes - you may just be rewarded by being allowed to take the first peek inside.

If you find something desirable that you want to buy, do not let it leave your hand for a moment until you've found the person running the sale and actually paid for it. If you're going to buy a piece of furniture that's too big to carry over to the seller, this is the time for the roll of masking tape and a black marker. Slap a piece of masking tape on your found object and mark it "sold" along with your name. Then there's no room for unpleasant misunderstandings to occur.

A map of all garage sales will be available at the Munday Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture on

the morning of the big event. It would be wise to spend just a few minutes pouring over the locations and the offerings there before you set out on your way - that way you can bypass all the locations who don't have items listed that capture your interest.

Also, don't forget that out-of-the-way locations may hold some very intriguing "finds" and may have less traffic than others. Therefore, you may take home some great buys from sales on the "way less traveled."

### Jobless Rate Dips to 4.5 Percent; Lowest April Rate Since 1979

Unemployment in Texas dropped to a seasonally adjusted rate of 4.5 percent in April, down from 4.6 percent in March, the Texas Workforce Commission announced today.

"This is our lowest April rate since 1979," said TWC Chair Diane Rath. "Texas employers added 14,800 Nonagricultural jobs last month and more than 250,000 over the year."

The gains include 6,500 construction jobs in April and 32,900 over the year. "That's a robust monthly growth rate of 1.2 percent and a yearly growth rate of 6.3 percent," said Commissioner Representing labor T.P. O'Mahoney.

"Finance, Insurance and Real Estate added 1,600 jobs in April," said Commissioner Representing Employers Ron Lehman. "This industry led the Service Producing Sector with an over-the-year job growth rate of 4.2 percent."

report all information about commercial cotton, noncommercial cotton, and all cotton grown for ornamental, research or any other purposes.

The reporting may be accomplished in two ways. First, producers may certify their acreage at their local Farm Service Agency by the final reporting date set by FSA for their area.

If producers choose not to certify their acreage through FSA, they must report the acreage to the foundation on a form available through the foundation's district offices. The deadline for reporting the acreage this way is the same as the final FSA reporting date.

Patches of ornamental cotton, volunteer growth, or any other unreported cotton, can be breeding grounds for boll weevils and need to be monitored in the same way as commercial fields - treating them should infestations appear.

in the Metropolitan Statistical Area was 1.4 percent in Bryan-College Station, followed by Austin San Marcos at 1.9 percent, Lubbock at 2.3 percent, Waco at 2.9 percent and Dallas at 2.9 percent.

The highest unemployment rate was 13.0 percent in the McAllen Edinburg-Mission MSA, followed by Brownsville-Harlingen-San Benito at 8.7 percent, El Paso at 8.3 percent, Beaumont-Port Arthur at 7.8 percent and Laredo at 7.7 percent.

"Our economy remains strong as the labor market continues to experience healthy job growth," Rath said.

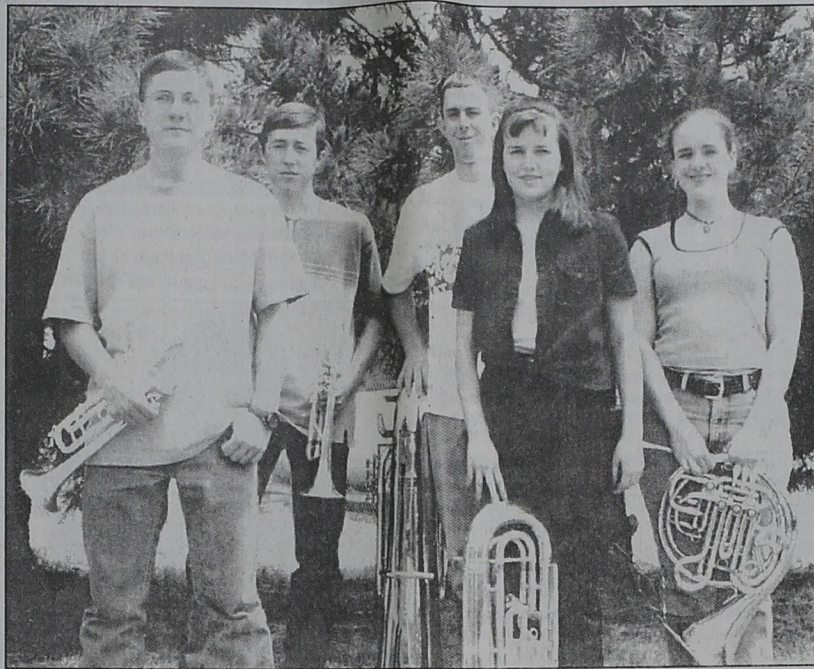

## Minding Your Own Business

with Don Taylor, co-author of Up Against the Wal-Marts

### Food for Thought if You're Thinking About Food

Gail Borden was the son of an American frontiersman. He was born in New York in 1801 and began his working career as a school teacher in Mississippi.

Borden worked his way across the south and eventually landed in Texas. He worked in politics, and is credited with assisting in the writing of the Texas State constitution.

While it was not what his name is best known for, Borden was also a newspaper reporter. He was the first to use the phrase "Remember the Alamo." His words would later become the battle cry of freedom for the Texans' heroic struggle to gain independence.

However, Gail Borden didn't make history with his early work. What Borden is best known for is milk. Specifically, condensed sweet milk that included additional sugar to prevent spoilage. His story is one of both failure and success. Like many entrepreneurs', fame and fortune did not run up and jump into Borden's lap. He hungered to get ahead in the food industry, but financial success eluded him in the beginning.

Borden's first food product--a dehydrated meat biscuit--won an international award for excellence in Europe. It was healthy and nutritious, but failed to sell well with the general public because of its taste.

Borden was nearly broke and traveling by boat in steerage class with poor European immigrants when inspiration struck. He watched many of the babies die on the trip because of infected milk. Haunted by what he had seen, Borden decided to learn how to prevent future disaster.

Borden spent months with the Shakers--a religious sect--to learn how they used vacuum cooking to preserve food. It was there he learned to remove water from milk to condense and preserve it. When he was 55, he received his first patent for sweetened, condensed milk.

The Civil War brought Borden's product to the attention of a nation. During and after the war, condensed milk and canned foods helped millions avoid starvation.

Borden's milk became a staple, an infant formula, and substitute for sugar in recipes.

The Borden Company also milked other innovations on its way to becoming an American food institution. They were the first company to sell fresh milk in bottles. They were first to homogenize milk in 1927 and also the first to add vitamin D. The company's research led to the first U.S. standards on pasteurization.

#### Don't Give Up

Gail Borden, like many of today's entrepreneurs, was a failure before he became successful. It was only through his continuing efforts that he ultimately achieved success.

Many food products were discovered by accident. Legend tells us that somewhere in the desert an Arabian trader discovered cheese when he attached a container of milk to his camel's hump during a long journey. Between the burning desert sun and the camel's joggling, the milk curdled. Cheese was born.

In 1890, a caring doctor in St. Louis wanted to provide an easily digestible source of protein for his aging patients. He selected peanuts as the source and began to grind them into pulp. He added a little salt and created peanut butter.

Harlan Sanders was broke and drawing Social Security when he decided to sell his "fried chicken" formula. Plagued by early failure, he went on to build one of the best-known and successful fast-food franchises in America: Kentucky Fried Chicken.

So, if you're thinking about food, keep thinking. More Americans eat than use the Internet. The next food innovation, healthy food franchise, or great tasting treat just might be yours. At least it's food for thought.

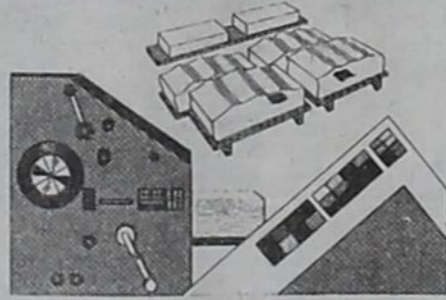

# Survey Finds That Students' Reading Skills Stagnate or Decline During Summer Months

In a just completed survey of kindergarten through sixth grade teachers, 77 percent said students return to school after summer break reading at levels that are either worse or the same as when they left for break. Of the 35 percent of teachers who said kids return to school at a worse reading level, 57 percent said they spend more than a month getting kids back up to speed.

The Shopforschool.com Summer Reading Survey, which questioned 900 kindergarten through sixth grade teachers in states around the country, also found that parents can play a key role in helping to avoid what teachers call "summer loss" -- the loss of reading skills while kids are on summer break. Nearly all teachers (97 percent) said parents should set aside time each day for their children to read, and 87 percent of them suggested at least 15 minutes to a half-hour each day.

According to Jolynn Maddox, a fourth grade teacher at Waterford Oaks Elementary School in Cedar Hill, TX, getting parents and kids together to work on reading skills over the summer would greatly assist teachers starting a new school year.

"On that first day of school students are expected to read in every subject," Maddox said. "Teachers end up spending a great deal of time recovering from that summer's learning loss and reviewing lessons learned the year before. If parents did dedicated time every day to reading with their child, teachers could jump start their school year and work on new learning right away."

The Shopforschool.com Summer Reading Survey also found that teachers have high hopes but lower expectations when it comes to the number of books they would like their students to read over the summer months.

While more than half of the teachers (51 percent) surveyed said that kids in kindergarten through sixth grade should read 11 books or more during the summer months--including 30 percent who

say they should read more than 20 books--more than 55 percent of the teachers expected kids to read 5 or fewer books during their break.

A majority of the teachers surveyed (60 percent) said parents are the most influential for getting their children to read, followed by teachers at 23 percent and friends at 13 percent. Most of the teachers surveyed (63 percent) suggested bedtime was the most popular time for kids to read books, followed by rainy days (15 percent). They also offered parents the following key tips to encourage their children to read this summer.

1. Be a positive role model by reading.
2. Set aside regular reading time
3. Take kids to the library
4. Limit the time kids spend watching TV
5. Have books available throughout the house
6. Help kids choose good books

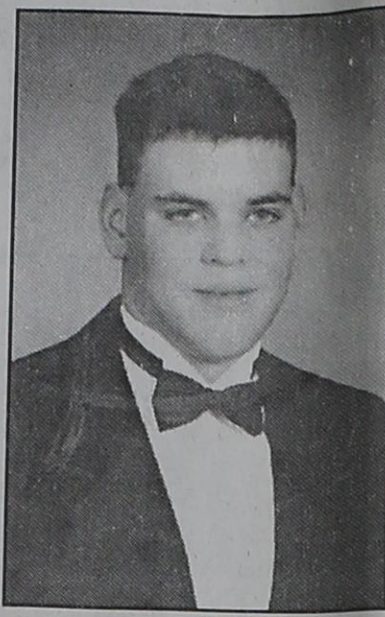
**Kandice McGhee**

**Michael Wayne Josselet**

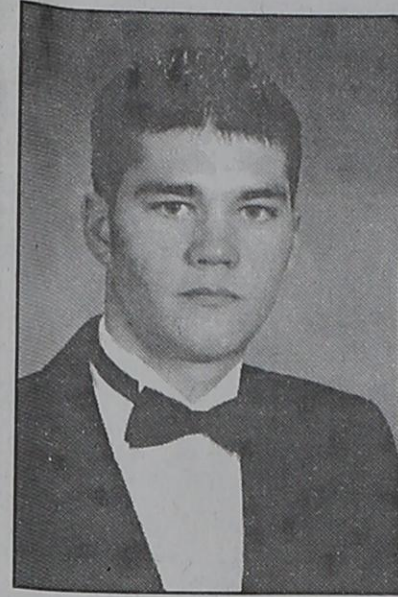
Michael is the son of Kyle and Melissa Josselet and plans to attend Texas State Technical College at Sweetwater.

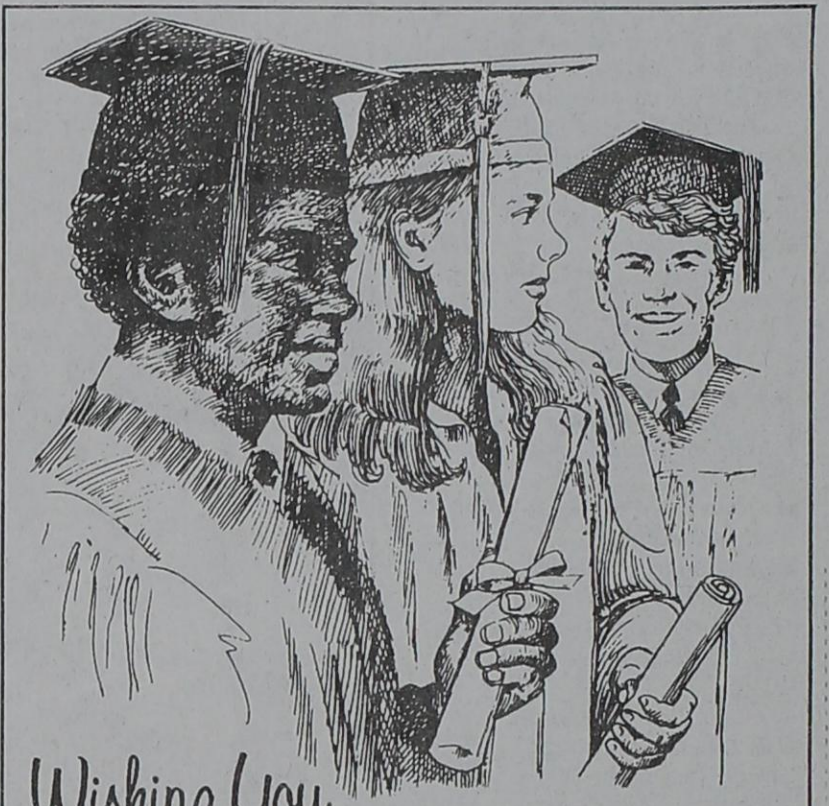
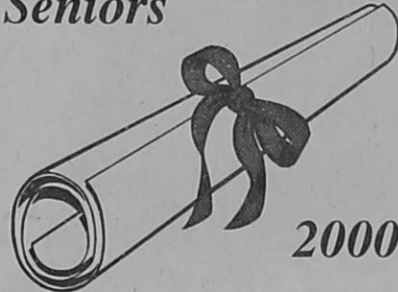
Chris and Brenda Brown are the parents of graduating senior, B.J. Brown. He will be attending Angelo State University.

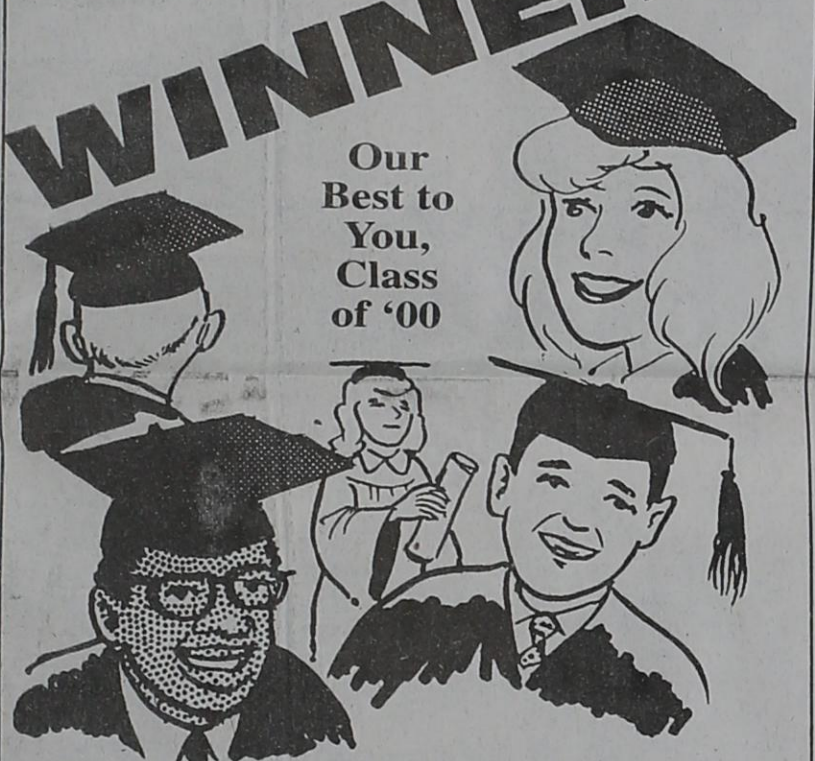

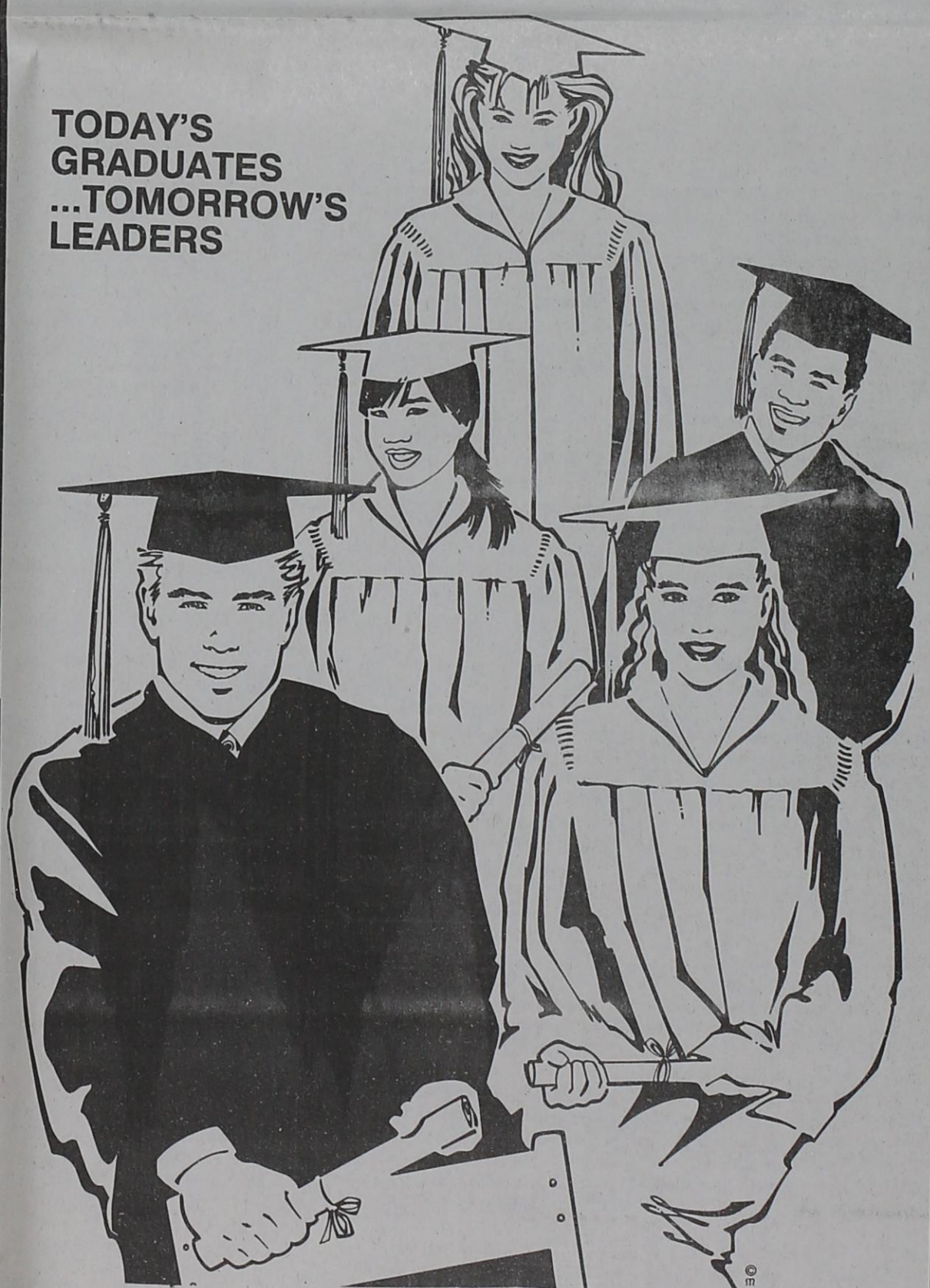

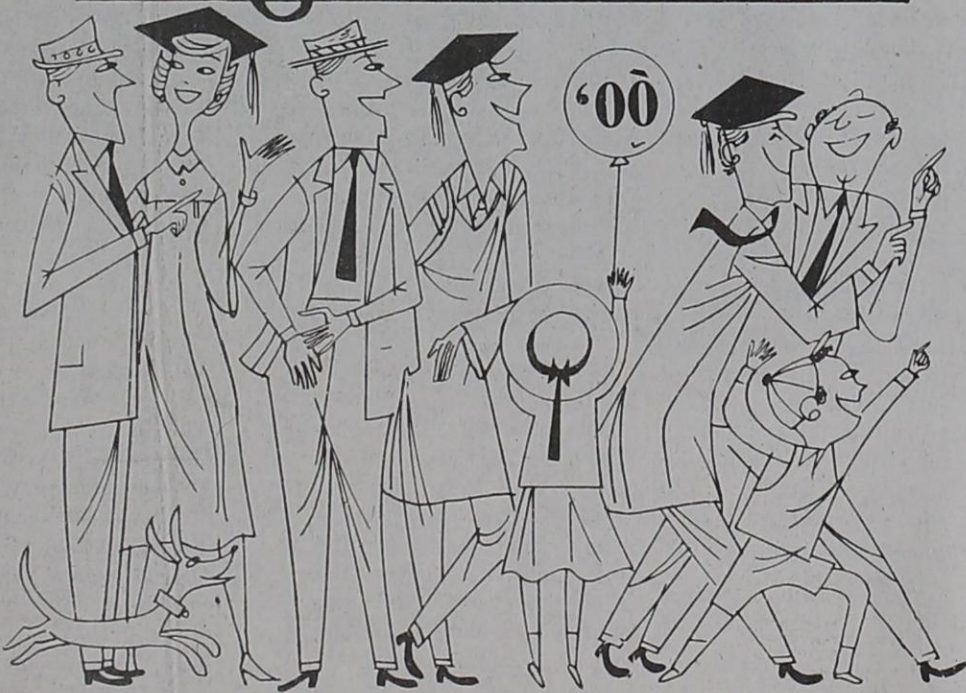
