And the retailer, finally, performs the last step in bringing meat to the home at a profit per pound as to hardly affect the selling price.

Eligible veterans may reinstate any amount of term insurance— from \$1,000 to \$10,000 in multiples of \$500-regardless of the length of time it has been lapsed under present liberal regulations. Questions And Answers

Q. Will the Government deduct money it paid on the guaranteed portion of my loan or the payments made for schooling and sub-sistence allowance from any future bonus that may be authorized by Congress?

A. No.

The recent finding of oil again at the "ghost town" of Leeray (on the Eastland-Stephens county line) after the spot had been deserted 20 years ago as "played out" reminds me of the time that I started an oil boom at Leeray—probably the shortest oil boom on record.

Leeray sprang up about 1919 in Leeray sprang up about 1919 in a wilderness of wolves and mesquite when oil was struck, The C. &N.E. railroad, building from Cisco to Breckenridge, built through the town, which grew to a population of perhaps 6,000. Then dry holes were hit and the people moved on. The buildings were torn down; piles of rubbish and streets, rapidly being reclaimed by grass and brush, were the only remainders of the one-time boom town.

It was late in 1923 that a friend of mine and I visited the scene. I had in mind writing an article on the "phantom city". My companion had a box camera, which he set up on a tripod, and took pictures. A small brick vault stood all by it-




