| ASHLAND CITY, TENN., TIMES: "Federal Judge Edward J. Dimock offered 13 convicted communist leaders an alternative to going to jail. The can escape jail by going to Russia. It was no suprise that defense counsel promptly rejected the go-to-Russia alternative. Communist leaders are rather inconsistent. They want to change the government in this country and pattern it after Moscow, but the alien country to which they give allegiance has no lure for them." <br> NEW ORLEANS, LA., HERALD: "Gen. Eisenhower has an unlimited opportunity. It is within his power to remedy the mistakes of the past, to restore respect for constitutional government, to reintroduce morality in the conduct of public business, and to subordinate politics to the interests and welfare of the people." <br> PETALUMA, CAL., ARGUS-COURIER: According to a survey of its members just completed by the Chamber of Commerce of the United States . . . . businessmen . . . . favored reducing waste in military expenses and foreign aid. Other proposed cuts are suggested in such projects as the Tennessee Valley Authority, farm price supports and related programs, and grants-in-aid to the States for social welfare programs." <br> "BIGNESS" DOESN'T MEAN MONOPOLY <br> The growth of big businses, it is often argued makes for monopoly. <br> That idea is not held in informed quarters. For example, the Brookings Institution has been working for five years on an exhaustive factual study of the role of big business in this country. In one section its report says, "The nationwide businesses . . . . may do more to break up the power of local monopolies than to cement tneir own." <br> We see examples of this on every hnad. The manufacturers of national brands, for instance, must be represented in every market place-and the result is much greater competition than would otherwise be the case. <br> A very important example can be found in retailing. A generation or so ago the small-town general store had pretty much of a monopoly. Competitors were few or non-existent. Mark-ups were extremely high compared with present-day standards. <br> Then the early chains came into being. They pioneered low-cost merchandising, and began to open outlets in more and more communties. Other kinds of retailers had to compete or perish. They did compete-and consumers everywhere received greater value than they ever had before. <br> In a free country, where government sticks to the role of "umpire", there is plenty of room for business of every size and kind. None has a monopoly of anything-for long. |
