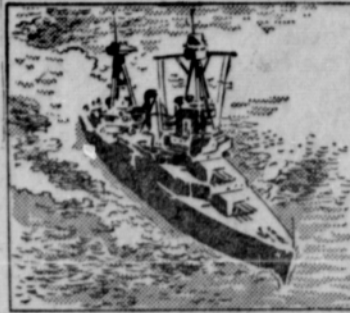

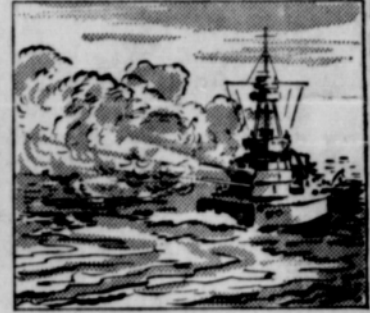
On the Seven Seas
