The movement starts rather slowly in the deep bass, the staccate notes of the big bassoon humorous suggesting the ungainly caperings the misshapen dwarfs that dwell underground. Gradually both temper and sounds are increased, the chase grows wilder and wilder, the rumb ling rocks beneath the flying feet of the maddened throng, while triplet figures in the upper registers are like the shrieks of the pursuing trolls. The limax and the end of the movement is a thunderous crash that represents the collapse of the hall at the sound of a distant church bell.




