On February 22 the people of the United States of America will observe with fitting ceremony the 194th anniversary of the birth of George Washington. Reverently and with thankful hearts a hundred million people will bow their heads in memory of a very great man whose unselfish devotion to an ideal made possible the building of this, the world's greatest nation.

As is comon in the history of all great nations and all great world figures, there has been built up around the name of this great man a fabric of tradition. What matter? Even if these things are proven-and it is not admitted that they are—the fact remains that George Washington was one of the world's noblest figures. That he was human; that he had faults; that he made mistakes, as all men have done—these things are certain. That he was unswerving in the high attributes of courage, of honesty, of patriotism and of unflinching devotion to the unselfish principles for which he stood-these are the things whereof were compounded his immortal claim to the tribute of the ages.
