

The Governor's Speech

It was the privilege of a representative of the News, among man and others from Foard, to man and others from Foard, to listen to the address of Gov. Campbell at Quanah, Tuesday, and while the speech cannot be reproduced through the News, a few of the most important matters upon which he spoke may be irefy ne uitened.

The Governor is mindful of the fact that he has, since the beginning of his administration, been assailed, as has the Thirtieth Legislature, but he classed his assailants as enemies not on-ly to himself but to the people and as friends to corporate in-terests within the State. These had bitterly opposed his policies and had sought to influence the legislature to actions favoring corporate interests, the legislature had been confronted by most formidable lobbies that ev-er assembled at the capitol of a state to defeat the will of the people, but defeat met the lob-yists. He was perfectly willing for his record of office to say whether or not he had been tru to his pledge to the people. He made a strong defense against made a strong defense against attacks upon the Thirtieth Leg-islature and pointed with patri-otic pride to the splendid laws they had enacted and the good results already realized.

results already realized.

Some of these laws were mentioned, among them being the Anti-Gambling Law, which makes the keeping of gambling houses a felony; the Anti-Free Pass Law, the effect of which is to destroy the feeling of mattickethich is executive. of gratitude, which is naturally felt towards the railroads by the man who has been favored with free passes. The Governor grew eloquent when he affirmed that if the legislature had not passed that measure, he would not now but Ocherate testate to to to to be canvassing the State, but would be at Austin with the legislature hammering on measure. The practice of the railroads in giving free passes is regarded by the Governor as one of the most gigantic evils that has ever been in our midst, and against this he made his strong-

The Tax Measure received more of the Governor's time during his speech than any other law passed by the legislature, the effect of which has been to equalize taxation in proportion to the property valuation. The powerful corporations in the State have been allowed to render their property at a very small per cent of its real value and have been escaping the taxation which they should have borne to equalize the burden upon all. The effect of that law is to lighten the burden of taxation upon those who have been paying more than their share and increase the burden upon those who have been escaping taxation. He stated that as a result the rate of State tax 1906 was reduced from 20c in 1907 to 12 1-2c and would this year someweere between 5c and 7c on \$100. Gov. Campbell feels that he has done all he can to relieve the people of heavy taxes and if the county commissioners will do their duty there will be a general reduction.

He was heard by a large and aprreciative audience and his speech will produce a telling effect at the coming primary.
