Assessessessessessessess old can recall a time when a good many well-minded citizens regarded the celebration of Labor regarded the celebration of Labor Day with no little misgiving. To them it denoted only the growth of a class consciousness which must in time so far alienate organized laborers from the rest of our National society as eventually to cause a complete social separation that must culminate in industrial warfare. Experi-ence happily has enlightened and reassured most of those saturnine gentlemen. Labor's sense of its dignity and of its power has grown, and the rest of us who have no place in its organization have come to recognize more or less adequately its importance as less adequately its importance as a contributing factor toward our political and social welfare. But the consequences of it all have not verified the lugubrious prophecies. Instead of having prophecies. Instead of having caused an increase in industrial warfare, the organization of labor and the greater recognition of its importance have resulted in a decrease of industrial war-fare. That is not an observation but the testimony of statistics. Strikes are diminishing, not at a fixed rate of progression, since the causes of disturbances are almost infinite and often beyond the regulation of any human force; but steadily nevertheless. And not only are strikes becom-ing steadily more uncommon, but the sense of interdependence as between employer and em-ploye has been constantly grow-ing. Warfare has been followed by a period of armed peace, and now we seem to be emerging into an era of cordial co-operainto an era of cordial co-opera-tion. The notion that a fair wage is the least that a man can be forced to work is being aban-doned rapidly by the largest and most enlightened employers of labor as one of the cruel con-ceptions born inevitably of a barbaric age. The tendency everywhere is, among large em-ployers of labor, to make their labor force an integral and co-ordinate bart of the employing GROCERY CO. ordinate part of the employing institutio

Facts that Labor Day Celebrates

Labor Day stands both for the recognition of organized labor's rights and for the recognition of labor's responsibility. It is therelabor's responsibility.
