Post's Main street has a new business opening here today as Eddie Wheeler has moved his machine shop here from Lubbock. The firm is Southwest Automatic Machine and is located at 318 East Main, the building formerly occupied by Veterinarian Larry Mills before he moved out to his new home of the Caprock Veterinary Hospital on US-84 northwest of Post.

Wheeler, a native of Tulla, says his shop is equipped to handle any kind of machine shop work for oilfields, farmers or ranchers. He will do in shop welding and fabrication, hydraulic cylinder repair and also will be selling all sorts of steel for various uses. Lamesa voters approved a \$3,000,000 bond issue to remodel their high school and add refrigerated air conditioning. Brownfield has let a \$400,000 contract to air condition three schools and their cafeteria by installing 2½ ton units in classrooms.

Survivors include three daughters, Mrs. Nicholas Flores, Mrs. George Soto and Mrs. Robert Espinoza, all of Post; four sons, Eusevio Torrez, and Tommy Gomez, both of Post, Leopoldo of Wichita, Kan., and Bisente of Brownfield; one sister, Leandra Cruz of Dallas; a brother, Louis Madrid of Adrian, Mich.; 49 grandchildren; 75 great-grandchildren; and 126 great-great-grandchildren.

Mrs. Bocanegra was a native of Pleasanton. She married Sam Bocanegra here in 1920. They moved to Austin in 1931 moving back to Post in 1937. She was a Catholic.

Garza's deepest oil test turns out to be 'duster'

What is believed to be the deepest oil test ever drilled in Garza County has been "plugged and abandoned" as a dry hole.

The announcement that Superior Oil Co.'s wildcat, the No. 1 C. E. Basinger, located a mile southwest of Southland, was a "duster" came over the weekend.

It had been drilled to a total depth of 9,845 feet. The test gains the distinction too of probably being the most expensive oil test ever made in Garza County as drilling costs are higher today than at any time in oil history.

Superior contracted the drilling with the biggest rig to drill in the county as well. The test was located just off US-84 and the drilling operation was watched with interest by motorists passing by.

Two other completions as well also have been an-

nounced. Jim and Carolyn Matthews of Lubbock have completed their No. 8 Post-Montgomery in the Garza field two miles east of Post as a 14 barrel a day

producer from an interval of 2,942 to 3,036 feet. It also pumps 29 barrels of water daily.

George R. Brown has the other new well, the No. 28-B. See Deepest oil, Page 16

Post oilfield worker killed

A Post oilfield worker was accidentally killed about 2:45 p.m. Thursday at a well site 15 miles southwest of Post when a pulling rig struck a high line and he was electrocuted.

Justice of the Peace Pat Kitchens ruled the death of Tirso Ramires, 24, an accident at the scene.

Ramires was an employee of the C & C Well Service and had been a resident of

Post about six months. The accident occurred when the rig was being erected, according to Justice of the Peace Kitchens.

Funeral services were to be conducted in San Luis Potosi, Mexico, under the direction of the Sunerales Garcia Funeral Home of San Luis Potosi.

Harvest almost over—

Crop cut to 31,000 bales

A 31,000 bale cotton crop for Garza County appears in the offing, according to a Post Dispatch gin check Saturday afternoon with five of the eight gins handling Garza cotton reporting they are about to finish up.

Seven of the eight gins were contacted with no report from the Southland gin which was not reached but for which an estimate was made to reach a county total.

The 31,000 bale estimate is about 2,000 bales below the 33,000 of a month ago when most of it was still in the field and educated guesswork.

Through mid-afternoon Saturday, 24,436 bales of Garza cotton had been ginned, there were 4,570 more bales stacked on gin yards with only an estimated 1,817 bales still in the field.

Gins reported farmers were averaging a half to three quarters of a bale an acre.

Grading was reported generally as "pretty good" and holding up well.

Buck Craft, Post gin manager, reported the last grades back Friday were the best received yet, some of the cotton just back being worth over 50 cents a pound in government loan.

Most farmers apparently are "waiting until next year" to determine what to do with their cotton.

There has been no upturn in cotton prices. This is the gin by gin report:

Post Gin — 2,400 bales ginned, 1,000 bales on yard and 2,000 area acres still to be harvested.

Storie Gin — 1,812 bales ginned, estimated 60 to 70 bales in area, yard clean.

Graham Gin — 5,566 bales ginned, about 2,000 on yard, maybe 500 still in field, farmers getting about three-fourths bale to acre.

Close City Gin — 5,500 bales ginned, 25 on yard, estimated 100 still in field, averaging two-thirds to three-fourths bale per acre.

Hackberry Gin — 9,255 bales ginned, half of which is counted as Garza cotton, 2,900 on yard, and estimated 200 in field.

Grassland Coop — 5,430 bales ginned, one-third of which is counted as Garza cotton, none on yard, maybe 200 bales still in field.

Producers Coop Gin — 4,885 bales ginned, one-fourth of which is counted as Garza cotton, 100 on yard and 200 bales estimated in field.

It looks like Christmas is going to be a gin holiday this year.

Garza's oilfields in 1980 had—

\$5,800,000 payroll

The sale of crude oil and natural gas from Garza County wells in 1980 boosted the county economy and accounted for \$163.3-million of the \$31.2-billion value placed on Texas production last year.

In a report on the economic impact of oil and gas industry operations in the top producing counties of Texas, Dallas-based Texas Mid-Continent Oil & Gas Association said this week the county ranked 50th among Texas' 254 counties on the basis of the value of its marketed petroleum production. This includes

condensate and casinghead gas.

The county's wells produced 7.5-million barrels of crude oil, valued at \$161.6-million, and 1.1-million Mcfs of natural gas, valued at \$1.7-million. Owners of royalty in the county received \$20.4-million as their share of the output, the Association said.

"Although crude oil and natural gas production in Texas declined slightly last year from 1979 levels, we in the industry are encouraged by the fact that drilling starts in 1980 were up 16-percent over the previous year," said the Association's chairman, Avery Rush, Jr., of Amarillo. "Since petroleum remains the cornerstone of our

Post receives \$170,916.70—

'81 sales tax sets record

The City of Post has received a record \$170,916.70 for its one percent sales

tax in 1981. State Comptroller Bob Bullock announced over the weekend the mailing of a December check to Post as its tax rebate totaling \$12,167.45.

This brought the total for the 12 checks received by Post this year to the \$170,916.70.

The total is 19.17 percent higher than the \$143,424.06 received in 1980.

Actually, the December check this year was slightly less than the \$12,961 received for the same month last year.

Post's robust economy is reflected in these figures and in the fact that Post's total sales tax "take" this year was well ahead of Slaton's \$167,791.54 in sales tax receipts despite the fact that Slaton has a highway shopping center which is making an organized effort to draw customer support from both Tahoka and Post.

Salton's percent increase in sales tax over 1980 was 15.72 percent compared to Post's 19.17 percent.

Looking at '82 elections—

All 8 incumbents expected to run

Garza's political pot has yet to begin simmering for the 1982 political campaign. So far no candidate has officially announced for office but all eight district, county, and precinct officials whose terms expire are expected by political observers to seek reelection.

At least, with a year still to go on their present four year terms, none has indicated he or she is about to retire.

Coming up for reelection, if all seek new terms, are County Judge Giles Dalby, District Judge George Hansard, County Clerk Carl Cederholm, County Treas-

urer Voda Beth Gradine, County Commissioner of Precinct 2 Ted Aten, County Commissioner of Precinct 4 Herbert Walls, Precinct 1 Justice of the Peace Zora Robinson and Precinct 4 Justice of the Peace Pat Kitchens.

Filings shouldn't be long in coming, however. It is customary not to file until after Jan. 1, but then if there's going to be a rush the filings for office come rather rapidly.

To date, there has been very little 1982 campaign talk at the county or precinct levels.

Car knocks over pole

Three young Post men suffered cuts and abrasions at 1:45 a.m. Saturday when the Z28 Camaro in which they were riding went out of control and knocked down an electric utility pole at the northwest corner of Main and Broadway.

According to deputy J. W. Jolly's accident report, Larry Rodriguez, 20, was driving the Camaro south on Broadway when he lost control approaching the intersection.

The car smashed into the utility pole, which was broken from its foundation and imbedded in the front of the Camaro which was "totaled."

Traveling with Rodriguez were Henry Samora, 22, and Paul Valdez, 17. All three were treated at Garza Memorial Hospital and released.

Street lights in the area had to be turned off so repairs could be made.

Early Remembrances of Christmas . . . an editorial

Each and every one of us has a head full of memories of Christmases past, especially those we enjoyed as a child.

We grew up in the Christmas era of white tissue paper for gift wrapping. The greatest thing about it was that it rustled delightfully.

We would lay awake in bed on Christmas eve behind a big curtain that divided our bedroom with the dining room. My parents couldn't "hide" that rustling tissue paper wrapping sound. Long after we had "grown up" to "the myth of Santa Claus", we would lie awake on Christmas eve and listen contentedly to the rustle of tissue paper wrapping of gifts. It was a perfect way to go to sleep — and seldom were we disappointed next morning.

We literally grew up too in the newspaper business. When we were young we had a "paper route" delivering the hometown Kansas daily after school on our bike. In fact we split a route with our older brother, he taking one side of the street and we the other. The route was 13 blocks long. After the papers were folded at the newspaper office so we could throw them with real distance and some accuracy, we would take our "third street route." In good weather, we used to time ourselves. We got so we could "carry the route" in just about seven minutes flat, but always with several papers sailing wildly into the bushes from where our customers would later have to look for them instead of onto their porches (almost every house had a porch in those days).

For the month before Christmas we were especially careful and tried not for speed but a 100 percent porch effort. Then when we collected our 15 cents a week (we got a nickel of it) on the Saturday morning before Christmas we would "expect" an extra quarter or so for a "Christmas gift". We usually got them too. The mayor lived in a big corner house on our route and his wife usually gave us a \$1 on that "Christmas Saturday." They had to maintain their position in the town and we were thankful for that.

One of our happiest memories of Christmas as a boy were the church programs and plays we participated in at Sunday School. The story of Christ's birth is never quite so pure and beautiful as it is when learned as a child.

The church services, of course, were a "little different". We didn't understand really what the preacher was talking about, but we loved church anyway at Christmas time because of all the Christmas hymns many of which we knew by heart.

A good choir can make a tremendous impression upon a youngster. We never had a voice for singing but we learned to love it anyway as a boy and still "hide" in the back row and enjoy flaying away with our vocal chords when the occasion presents itself.

Another part of Christmas which is mostly missing today is the many efforts to help the poor — and there were as many poor people then, if not more than there are today. There wasn't any welfare then. Through the year it was up to the churches to take care of their own and considerable thought and time was spent doing it, finding "little jobs" of the part-time variety which could be found in the house or yard, and dropping a hot dish by once in a while which was big enough to last for at least two meals.

At Christmas time, of course, the churches were really busy. But then again so was everybody else. The town organizations, the kids at school all "adopted" families and some careful planning went into these processes.

The "most fun" though was for one, two or three families to go together and "adopt" a family of their own. Nothing was said. The family adopted never knew from where all the yule goodies came, but there were clothes for all the youngsters (that fit by size and were good quality hand-me-downs), enough food in the basket for not only the holiday itself but for several days after. Then there were the gifts. Gaily wrapped presents for everyone with at least two toys per child.

We learned very early in life that it was not just better to give than to receive — but that it was actually more fun too.

Talk about Christmas feasting. We always had "three Christmases" when we were growing up. First was the one at home with a hearty breakfast preceding the gift opening as required by mother's edict. At noon we would drive four blocks to the home of our two maiden aunts and unmarried uncle who lived together throughout their lives, never marrying.

They had one of those "fireless cookers" now extinct. Heavy round stones were heated and the food was placed on the heated stones and cooked slowly over several hours much as the crock pots work today. Chicken literally fell off the bone when cooked in one of those "fireless cookers" and you should taste a turkey so prepared.

There was a second tree after noon dinner. Of course there was plenty of new things to play with so the afternoon passed quickly and before we knew it the time had come to go to Grandpa and Grandma Cornishes' for Christmas supper. Ah, what a feast.

Grandma was a specialist with chicken dumplings and one of the greatest disasters of the modern age is that old-fashioned chicken dumplings have literally disappeared from the scene. We ate her dumplings for years on Sunday nights (we followed the same feasting procedures on Sundays each week as we did on Christmas.) but she would never disclose her recipe to anyone. It was a "secret" she kept as far as we knew throughout her long and happy life. You had to have a well operating stomach to eat your way through the Christmases of my childhood.

White Christmases were best. There were more of them in Kansas than there are here in West Texas, but they were still a real holiday occasion for a kid living there.

The only skiing done in those days, at least as far as we knew, was done by rich Europeans in the Swiss Alps. But everybody had a sled, and you could have some wild and dangerous rides when hooked onto the back of a car, with or without the driver's knowledge.

Ford's black "tin lizzies" was the No. 1 car in those days because you could buy one for about \$350. Our neighbor across the street to the north was a local carriage maker. He "retired" and closed up his shop when Henry introduced mass production of automobiles to America.

When you rode sleds behind them you had to use a muffler — they were "big stuff" then — to wrap around your mouth and nose to keep out the exhaust fumes.

Christmas in our earliest memories was the greatest day of the year in so many ways. Thanksgiving and the Fourth of July were No. 2 and 3 but didn't even come close to Christmas.

Christmas stands out so much in those memories as a family day, and as a religious day. Churches always held Christmas morning services in those days and everybody dressed up in their new shirts, ties, suits and dresses and after church saw friends from near and far who had "come home for Christmas."

LUBBOCK — Producing cotton under the farm bill passed by the House in Washington Dec. 16 will be pretty much "business as usual."

The cotton program included in the bill is the same basic "market-oriented" program in effect for the past four years, and with one major exception the differences in the cotton sections of the 1977 and 1981 bills are largely a matter of numbers.

The major exception is the absence of a disaster program in the new law. That program, put into the 1973 farm act through the efforts of Plains Cotton Growers, Inc., Lubbock, for eight years has provided sorely-needed crop loss insurance to farmers. "But unless it can be reinstated at some future date," laments PCG President Gary Ivey of Ralls, "That program is a thing of the past."

The Commodity Credit Corporation loan rate will be figured on the same formula as before — the lower of (1) 85 percent of the average of the median three of the preceding five years U. S. spot market prices or (2) 90 percent of the preceding 15 weeks adjusted average prices in Northern Europe, except that when Northern Europe prices average below the U. S. spot average, the loan can be set anywhere between the two. The only "improvement" in the loan-setting procedure is an increase in the 1981 law's statutory minimum, to 55 cents a pound, up from this year's 48-cent minimum.

The loan formula for 1982 is expected to set the loan just above 57 cents, up from this year's 52.46 cents. PCG, along with efforts to get the disaster program extended, worked for a minimum loan of 65 percent of parity. But both causes fell before the Administration's scattergun attack on government expenditures.

als. First it says premiums and discounts are to be set at a simple average of the prior year's loan differences and the previous nine-month spot market differences. Then it directs the Secretary to establish a 10-member committee to study procedures and criteria used to set differentials and gives his authority to conduct his own review of the process, including the committee's recommendations.

Target prices under the new law will be the higher of (1) 120 percent of the base loan rate or (2) 71 cents in 1982, 76 cents in 1983, 81 cents in 1984 and 86 cents in 1985. The old law called for basing target prices on cost of production changes.

Leftover Turkey
 Leftover turkey can make a delicious post-holiday meal. The following recipe will give you a chance to change leftovers into a new meal.

Hot Turkey Salad
 1 cup cooked turkey, cubed
 1 cup chopped celery
 1 cup chopped pecans
 1/2 cup mayonnaise
 1 T. lemon juice
 1 T. chopped onion
 1/2 cup grated cheddar cheese
 Salt and Pepper to taste
 Crushed chips
 Mix all ingredients except chips and place in baking dish. Cover the top with crushed chips. Bake at 350 degrees for about 20 minutes (or until salad bubbles around the edges.)

Safety Hints
 (1) When foods are left sitting out after the meal, the risk of food poisoning increases. You can not always tell if a food is safe to eat by taste, appearance, or smell. So if you know a perishable food has been left sitting at room temperature or handled carelessly, throw it out. Give special attention to holiday dishes such as cold meats, poultry, stuffing, potato salad, meat salads, cream pie and eggnog. A general rule to follow is: Keep hot foods Hot and Cold foods Col.

(2) Do not stuff poultry a day ahead. Stuff just before roasting because stuffing inside a warm turkey is a breeding place for bacteria. Refrigerate leftover poultry and stuffing in separate dishes as soon as possible.

Sue Maxey's Divinity Recipe
 4 cups sugar
 1 cup Karo Syrup
 3/4 cup water
 Boil until spin a thread, or to hard ball stage in cold water.
 Beat 3 egg whites until peak stage. Pour above mixture over egg white and beat. Add 1 teaspoon vanilla and continue to beat until creamy. Pour in greased platter.

Leftover Turkey Salad
 3 cups cubed leftover roast turkey
 2 hard-cooked eggs, sliced
 Two-thirds cup chopped sweet pickle
 2 cups chopped celery
 1 teaspoon lemon juice
 1/2 cup salad dressing or mayonnaise.
 Select four center slices of egg for garnish; chop remaining eggs. Mix chopped eggs with other ingredients. Serve on salad greens. Garnish with egg slices sprinkled with paprika. Serves six.

As of March 1, 1981, there were 1,765 producing oil wells in the county.

Petroleum processing also contributed to the county economy, with two natural gasoline plants, having a total daily capacity of 2.6-million cubic feet of natural gas, in operation.




