# Post ISD trustees begin plans for central air and heat for campus buildings

by Wes Burnett

After a lengthy discussion of the proposed installation of central air conditioning and heating for all three Post ISD campus buildings, trustees authorized the advertising of bids for the project, which will include a variety of emergency repairs as well as other improvements.

Funding for the project will come from ISD reserves.

Among the other maintenance items to be bid are painting, installation of Baptist University, Writing Program Faculty, Summer in France Writing handicapped facilities at both gymnasiums, auditorium sound system improvements, upgrading of the high school science lab, installation of vinyl flooring at the middle school and addition of six new classrooms at the elementary school.

Bill Stracener, architect and engineer, reported that a serious crack in the Literary Quarterly, Paris Atlantic, Paris Magazine, The Christian Science walls of the middle school gym have been discovered. Although not serious enough to close the facility, Stracener told trustees that water leaking around the

> Superintendent Bill Shiver told board members that the state is aiming to force all ISDs to tax at the rate of \$1.50 per \$100 and to set standard salaries for teachers state wide. The current tax rate for Post ISD is \$.93, and under the projected losses of state funding recently enacted by the Texas Legislature, the tax rate will be increased approximately 45 percent to maintain current levels.

## Sales tax rebate continues impressive gains for Post

The City of Post received a \$19,776.28 check from the state comptroller, representing a 35.99 percent increase over the same period last year and a 23.87 percent increase for the year.

Last year's check at this time was \$14,542.75. The year to date total of \$79,126.22 is an increase over the same period last

year of \$63,879.66.

This month's check included taxes collected on March sales and reported in April by businesses filing monthly returns and also includes taxes reported by those filing quarterly returns for sales made in January, February and March. Through the first five months of 1991, the state has rebated a total of \$740.9

million to city and county governments for a 10.6 percent increase over the same period last year.

A 35 year old woman paid a \$118 fine on a theft under \$20 charge. The case was filed in municipal court.

## This ANN That

**Home Economics** May 20-27 is BUCKLE UP AMERICA WEEK!! I would like to strongly encourage all of you to use your seat belts on every trip you make in a motor vehicle.

More than 20,000 lives have been saved by seat belts alone from 1983 to 1989. In 1982, before any state had a seat belt use law, America buckled up at an 11 percent rate. Use of seat belts has more than quadrupled since then in response to increased law enforcement efforts and public information campaigns. As encouraging as these results are, it's not enough! People are still being killed on our highways because they didn't take the time to buckle

Even more disturbing than the adults who are fatally or seriously injured, are the children who are killed or damaged for life because they were not properly restrained while riding in the family vehicle.

Children are the most valuable cargo ever carried in a vehicle, but they are often not treated as though they are. When adults pack valuables, they do not just toss them in the back seat. They pack them in appropriate packaging with the correct padding and place them in the most secure spot in the vehicle "just in case."

How do adults transport children? Sometimes not as carefully as the material possessions which are being carried. Yet what could be more valuable or precious? Texas law says that children under two years up to four years of age must ride in a safety seat or buckled in by a safety belt.

Some parents thing they can protect infants and children from injury by holding them in their laps, but they cannot. In a 30 mph crash, a child may be thrown forward with a force equal to 30

times its own weight. If the adult is wearing a seat belt, the child can be torn from the adult's arms and hurled into the dash or windshield. If the adult is not wearing a safety belt, both may fly forward with the probability that the child will be crushed between the adult and the dash of the vehicle.




