Nichols honored on retirement

Family and friends of Martin Nichols honored him at a special retirement dinner last Sunday following his completion of 39 years of service with Ray Diekemper and RJD Management Company.

The dinner was held at the Chaparral Steak House January 13, 1991.

A recent company newsletter outlined Nichols' experiences:

Time takes some things from a man and gives him some things. In Martin Nichols case, its mostly given him a lot; a large family, a deep and strong faith - and a dry sense of humor.

Ask Martin how long he has worked for RJD Management.

"Well, I've worked for Ray Diekemper in the oil field for almost 40 years. Haven't decided yet whether I like it or not, though."

Even over the telephone, you can hear the grin in Martin's voice.

Martin began working for Alamo Corporation in April, 1951 when Ray Diekemper was a partner in that company.

Martin was born on February 21, 1913 in San Augustine County in East Texas and moved with his parents to Roaring Springs in 1919. His father was a farmer and later a school custodian in Sundown and Post. Martin loves to fish and still likes to return to East Texas to fish at Toledo Bend.

Martin attended country schools until the sixth grade. This was during the depths of the Depression and Martin dropped out of school because work was more important than an education.

"I got a quality education from life," Martin says with no regrets.

While working on a farm and ranch for K. Stoker at Post, Martin met his wife-to-be, Dale Bartlett. Dale was employed by the Stokers as a cook and housekeeper and they were married on October 19, 1935.

Martin began working part-time in the oil field in 1936 as a tool dresser on a drilling spudder. His pay then was a whopping \$3.50 a day.

Martin progressed to become a driller and learned the art of drilling with rotary rigs. He was exempted from the service in World War II because his occupation was deemed critical to the war effort and because of his growing family.

Martin and his family moved around a lot pursuing his career in the oil field. He has called Kermit, Snyder, Big Spring and Fort Stockton home at times but a large part of his life has been spent in Garza County.

In the Fall of 1954, the company built a house for the Nichols family four miles northeast of Post. They moved in on December 18, 1954 and, just in time for the arrival of their last baby daughter, completing a family of four daughters and two sons. Two of the girls were married in this house.

Martin was production superintendent most of the 22 years he lived on the lease. He still cares for the Effie Dunn and Sarah Harrison leases.

Martin and Dale are members of the Primitive Baptist Church and attend services every Sunday at the Church at 44th and Avenue P in Lubbock.

Martin is proud that he helped organize the Little League Baseball program in Post in 1955 and both his sons, David and Doyle, played every stage of youth baseball.

In addition to six children, the Martins now have seventeen grandchildren and fifteen great-grandchildren.

GMH hires new lab supervisor

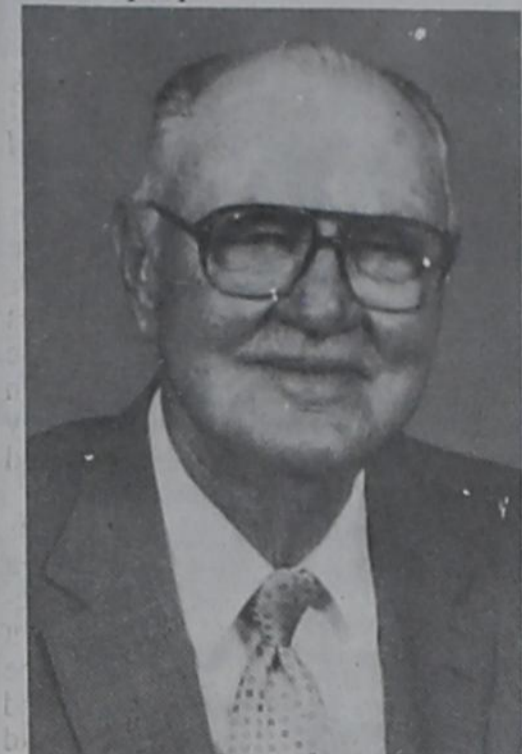

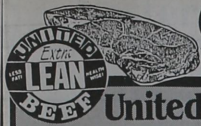

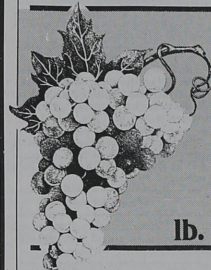
