We，friends and patients of Dr．G．Jeffrey Young，received this letter from him last week and we feel that the whole community should know why he is leaving Post and about some situaitons here in the community．Please read the letter in its entirety and maybe it wil
enlighten all of you．

#  

When I chose to go back to medical school，three things were upmost on my mind．First，I wanted
to be a family physician．Unlike many of my peers，I felt that I could be of the most service and fill a critical to be a family physician．Unlike many of my peers，I felt that I could be of the most service and fill a critical
need if I chose family medicine．A residency－trained，board crified faily need if chose family medicine．A residency－trained，board certified family physician can care for $90 \%$ of
the problems for $90 \%$ of patients and their families，making appropriate referrals to other specialists in cases
Whered I wanted to practice where there was a need．Rural West Texas has been medically underserved for years．This need is best filled by residency－trained，board certified family physicians， especially if they can provide a broad range of services such as obstetrics and minor surgery．The survival of rural hospitals is dependent on having a staff of physicians who can provide just such a broad range of
services on a local basis．
Thirdly，I did not want to be a doctor unless I could assure myself and my patients that I was offering the highest standard and most up－to－date medical care that was possible．Either I was going to do it
right，or not do it at all right，or not do it at all．

When Syan and I came to Post a year ago，it was with energy and enthusiasm to provide that kind of
care to the people of this community．The practice of medicine has chat care to the people of this community．The practice of medicine has changed radically over the past 20 years
and the rate of change keeps increasing．Competent care requires continuous updating of knowledge and and the rate of change keeps increasing．Competent care requires continuous updating of knowledge and
skills．It also requires the cooperation of the other physicians in the community．Long gone are the days when a lone＂country doctor＂could come out of medical school，without a residency of three or more years， hang out a shingle and practice medicine for the rest of his career with the same knowledge and skills with
which he started． which he started．
had no idea of how I knew that I would not be welcomed with open arms by the other physicians in livelihood or＂stealing patients，＂but rather to provide an alternative to those people traveling to Lubbock for heir medical care．I think that my highly－motivated and knowing office staff and I have been able to offer a Post and the surrounding area．

A year later，however，I find myself very tired，disillusioned and disappointed．The local medical conmmunity does not cooperate at all，and I found myself presented with a time and workload burden for activities，than before we moved here．During Syan＇s illness and hospitalizations，I was able to be with her

partner This situation is not recent，it has been brewing for several months．Attempts were made to recruit partner for the practice，however to no avail．Post will financially support only three physicians．As long as
there are three physicians here，there is not a prospect of attracting a fourth．This is despite the fact that two of the physicians are not active in the operation of the local hospital．Both of the other physicians have been here for many years，and I only one．Therefore，I will be the one to make the change．
I will be closing my practice in Post as of 30 June 1991．I will be joining the practice of a
colleague，with whom I rained in colleague，with whom I trained in residency．I will be the third physician in the Levelland Clinic，joining
Bill Balch and Dr．Michael Bailey．I was welcomed enthusiastically by these two physicians who are Bill Balch and Dr．Michael Bailey．I was welcomed enthusiastically by these two physicians who are
current in their skills and medical knowledge，and are willing to cooperate to provide care to their patients， sharing call and encouraging excellence in care．

I sincerely appreciate the response from the people of Post concerning this move．Syan and I appreciated the many visits，phone calls and the petition which so many of you had signed．Believe me，we have been agonizing over this decision for months．Many a sleepless night was spent discussing，praying happened to，I only hope that I will be the last．If there had been any other way to improve the situation，we
her would have tried it．It is exceedingly tough to recruit a family physician today．For every board eligible or board certified，residency－trained family physician，there are thirty to forty potential positions available．To
find one willing to do obstetrics and minor surgery limits the search even further．There is just no hope on find one willing
the horizon．
Your concerns and your petition ARE important，but in a different way．Garza Memorial Hospital will close if the situation that I faced is not rapidly remedied．If the other doctors won＇t support the hospital and cooperate，then the hospital WILL close．Even if another physician follows me to Post，he or she will
not be able to do it alone，and will find themselves in the same situation as I．Yes，the hospital has had，and still does have some problems．To be fair，this is not why I have chosen to leave Post．Methodist Hospital is assuming the management of Garza Memorial and will help to bring about changes that are already in progress．Care at GMH has improved and a broader range of services is now offered．This has required a great deal of work，and there should be recognition of this fact．The community MUST support these changes and support Methodist in its effort to bring these about．If the town does not support the hospital and make sure that the doctors on the medical staff do the same，the hospital will close．If it does close，it will not be reopened．Forty hospitals have been closed in Texas over the past six months，many under the sam circumstances which now face GMH．The closing of the hospital would doom Post to loosing out on
chances to attract new industry or improving the local economy．This would hurt everybody in Post．

As for the continuation of your care，all records are to be transferred to my new office．We would be happy to continue to provide care for your family at the Levelland Clinic．Interestingly，it takes no more
time to drive from Post to Levelland（via F．M．1585）than it does to drive to Lubbock，fight the traffic and find a place to park．If you choose not to come to Levelland，we would be happy to refer you to another physician with similar qualifications．Copies of your medical record will be made available to you，or sent to office in Post，for the time being．All account payments and questions regarding insurance should be directed
