## Holding current tax line up to school district voters

| Post Independent school district trustees Monday night voted unan imously to offer district voters the proposition of school integration here next year as the only fore seeable way to prevent a hefty school tax boost in the fall. <br> Action came after a lengthy special session at which every portion of the proposed $\$ 586,861$ school budget for $1962-63$ was carefully explored before consideration was given to such a step. <br> The board issued the following statement to district school patrons to explain this course of action as an essential economy measure: <br> Your school trustees are faced | must be cut to hold the tax line. we feel can be effected through stringent economes without serious ly impairing the educational opportunities of our boys and giris. <br> We cannot ourselves take the integration step which we are recommending to you as the only alternative to a tax raise. The laws of Texas provide that this only can be legally done by the approval of the voters of this school district. <br> Therefore we are calling for a petition on integration so as to submit this proposal to you. | "It is our unanimous opinion that the only economic choice left to the district is to vote to integrate or to accept a tax increase. <br> Another important factor we must consider too is that if we do not integrate now, costly improvements are facing us at Lincoln school. This will cost more tax money, considerably more. <br> Even such an expensive course of action-which we in good conscience cannot recommend-is no assurance that we will not be con- fronted any day by integrationnow the law of the land. | If integration is accepted, all grades will be integrated and arrangements will be made to discharge the present facuky of the Lincoln Elementary School.? <br> The Texas law provides that 20 per cent of registered school district voters must sign a petition asking for such an election before it can be called. <br> Lowell Short and Leo Acken two of the three members of the district's board of equalization, met with the trustees to discuss the proposed budget and gain a better understanding of it. |
