Strip Christmas of its tinsel, its parties, and its prettily wrapped gifts. Don't pur up a Christmas tree. Leave all the ornaments on the high closet shelf and forget the greeting cards.

Even send old Santa packing right back to the North Pole and tell him to

Now! What's left of Christmas?

The answer is plenty—and it's the part we've mostly been missing.

Look back into your own memories and think of all those wonderful Christmases stretching behind you. What do you remember best?

Look closely and you'll probably find that it's the original Christmas story and how we learned it as children, with all its wondrous simplicity. Next we love the beautiful Christmas music-the carols sung out in the cold nights, in the choir lofts, and on the pleasant hush of bright Christmas mornings in the churches of our choice. Third, we remember best that wonderful season when it is such a joy just to give to someone less fortunate than ourselves.

The cry to "put Christ back into Christmas" is the cry of a long decade ago. You seldom hear it anymore—even in our churches.

All the rest of the American Christmas is wonderful too but it is not the really important part of it. Let's not lose the true joy of Christmas this Christ-

Why are we nicer as people at Christmastime than through the rest of the year? That's a holiday thought worth considering too. We find ourselves a bit more Christian as we approach His birthday—only to see it vanish again When we can learn to live with the joy of Christmas in our hearts the

whole year through, then we can truly call ourselves Christian. A local pastor, talking of Christmas from his pulpit last Sunday morning, pointed out that today's Christians stand with one foot in the church and the other in materialistic world with its vastly different goals. He went on to say

that the problem is to find a bridge from reliaion to our everyday lives. For if we could, think how different life on this jumpy, old care-worn world would be. Think of how we could mix love with the billions being spent on armaments this year and carry the nations of this world into a whole new

age of finer, more purposeful living We can find our best illustrations of this "bridge" between the rhurch and our materialistic world in the Christmas season. It is at this time of year that we project Christ's simple code of living-"love one another"-best into our everyday lives. In the Christmas season, we receive our greatest satisfaction in doing nice things for other people, often less fortunate than ourselves. But the Christmas "bridge" doesn't last long enough—and isn't big

Certainly, it is not easy to transform Christian principles into Christian action. Flse this great nation would have a much better "image" to the world today. We try so hard, we often lead with our hearts, and we give much of our material blessings. And all for such small results. We must learn better, as both individuals and as a nation, to build "the bridge" between Christianity and the world.

Looking back over the last 15 years, when America led the rush into the met. We marvel at the methods by which this nation's industrial "know how" and even our democratic educational system were marshaled to the cause of nuclear development and how the people and agreement together accepted the task of spending a great portion of this nation's vast wealth to finance

If only a tenth of this brilliant and creative manpower, this organization, and only a few hillion of these dollars could be brought together to accept the Christian challenge of finding the "bridge" between the Christian faith and the world in which we live.

Who ran foretell how great such results might be?

Somehow even we would judge a "crash program" for Living Christianity as impractical. And that again brings us back to the problem pointed out by one pastor here Sunday from his pulpit—how can we build such a "bridge?" In finding such an effort impractical we are admitting in our hearts that the gap does exist between our Christian concepts given to us by Christ, whose birthday we are preparing again to celebrate, and the world in which we live

Here truly is a greater challenge than any nuclear age, any orbit into space, or any journey to the moon. Let us ask ourselves this Christmas, how can we become "bridge builders?"-JC

Membership on the juvenile board is strictly non-remunerative. The only pay the chairman, six regular members and four alternates expect is the cooperation of the public, especially the parents, in helping reduce the community's juvenile delinquency problem.-CD.
