CHANGES MADE IN S. S. LAW TO BENEFIT MANY

The 1960 amendments to the social security law reduce by about one-third the length of time a person has to work under social security to become insured for the payment of benefits to himself and his family.

Some 400,000 people are now eligible for cash benefits because of this change in the law, including many wives, widows, dependent husbands and widowers already at or beyond the retirement age, and minor children of deceased workers. First payments to newly eligible persons will be for the month of October, 1960.

Under the new rule, persons reaching retirement age (65 for men, 62 for women) this year need only about 3 years of work under social security instead of the 4-1-2 to 5 years required by the old law. If you reach retirement age any time next year, you will need to have worked under social security for only 3-1-4 years instead of the 5 to 5-1-4 years required before the change in the law. There is, however, a minimum requirement of a year and half of work under social security without which no benefits can become payable.

There are a number of people in Lynn, Borden and Dawson counties who will now be able to get monthly payments as a result of this change.

The change in law also provides monthly benefits are now payable to all children under age 18 whose fathers are deceased, providing he was insured, regardless of whether or not the minor child is living with and chiefly supported by a stepfather. Under the old law dependency on the step father prevented payment on the natural father's earning record.

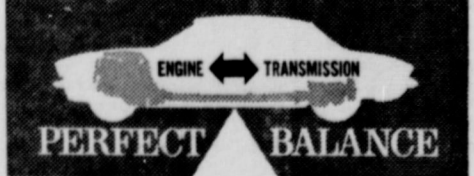

**Purple Heart Veteran
Deported as Wetback**

SAN ANTONIO—Immigration authorities sent a 21-year-old Purple Heart veteran of Korea back to Mexico as a "wetback" recently.

The veteran, Cpl. Alberto Gonzales of Monterrey, Mexico, was sent in an immigration bus to Laredo, Tex., to be put off in Mexico. Immigration Officer W. L. Meubhouse said he had entered the United States on a dead man's birth certificate before he joined the American army three years ago. Wetbacks—named for those who swim the Rio Grande—are illegal entrants.

The G.I. Forum, which works on the problems of Latins in San Antonio, assigned an attorney, Richard Casillas, to the case with instructions to "go all the way to the state department if necessary" to allow Mr. Gonzales to live in the United States.

The immigration office said he was being allowed to leave the country "voluntarily" and predicted he could get a permanent visa from the American consul in Mexico that would allow him to come back in time for the wedding.

Mr. Gonzales was discharged from the army at Fort Sam Houston.

He joined the Army Sept. 17, 1948, and enlisted for another three years on the same date last year. Vella Sanchez, 20, his fiance, said he had spent a year in Korea, with headquarters of the Eighth army.

"He was wounded in the hip and got a broken ear drum," she said. "He has the Purple Heart, five campaign stars, the United Nations ribbon, the Korean service ribbon and a unit citation."

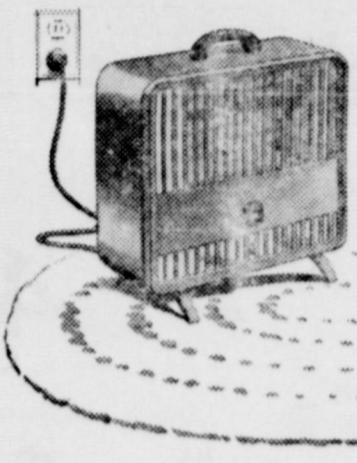
**Spare Parts for Body
Are Available to Man**

NEW YORK—Spare parts for the human body still can't be ordered from a mail-order catalog. Nevertheless, the advance of medicine during the past few years has made available an imposing array of replacements for damaged or ineffective organs.

Following the development of the blood bank, first of the spare-part repositories, ingenious surgeons have found ways to maintain banks for eyes, bone, cartilage, arteries and veins. There are now methods for transplanting whole organs from one individual to another, and for constructing replacement organs from tissues taken from the patient's own body.

Some man-made spare parts, such as the artificial kidney, are already coming into clinical use, while others, among them the mechanical heart and plastic heart valves, are well along in the expe-

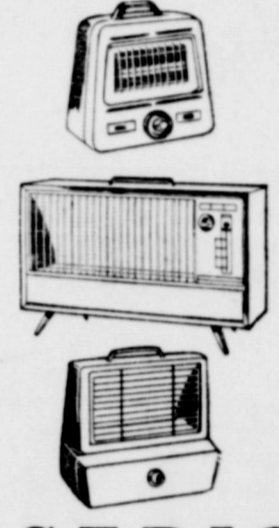

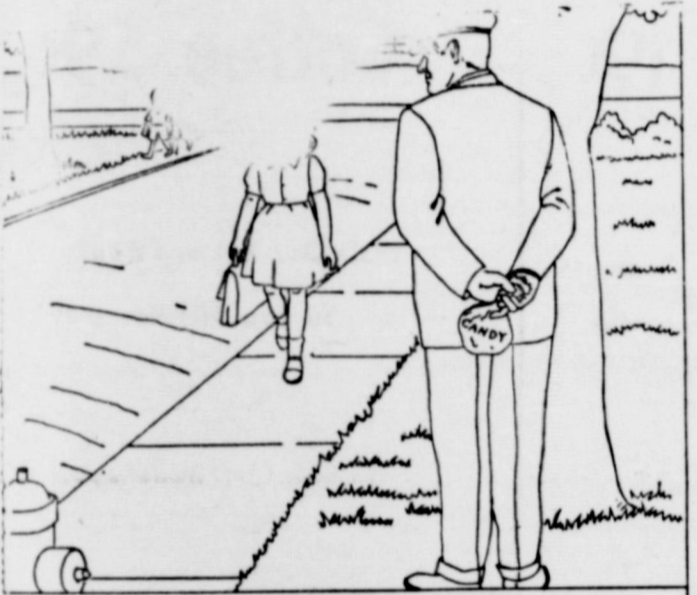

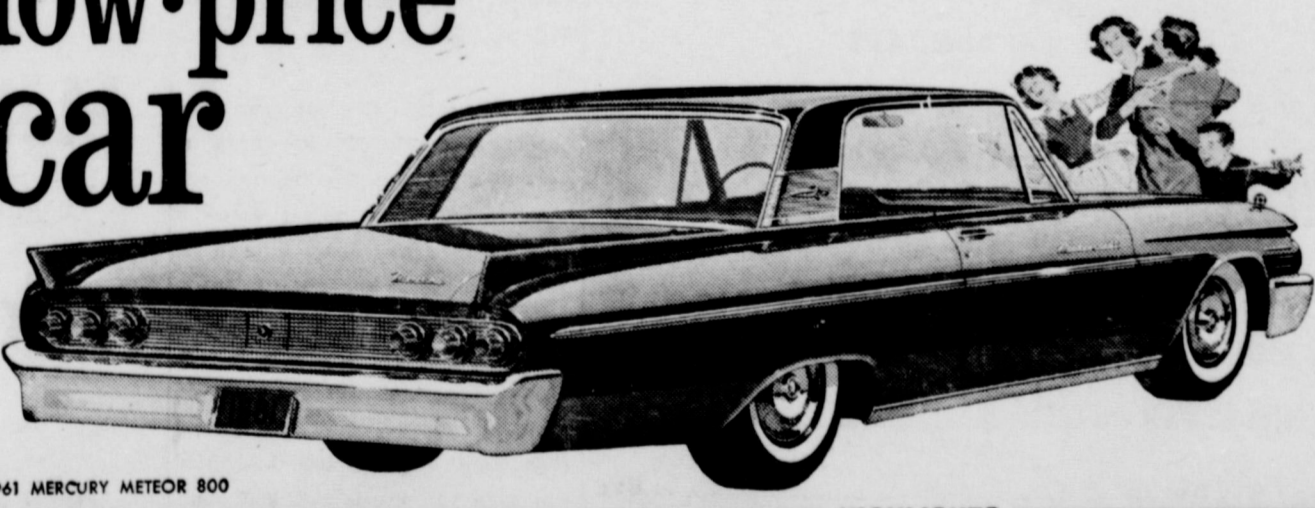
