'46 Club Wins First Place In Rodeo Parade

O'Donnell is tired but happy this week after having the best rodeo and parade in history last week end. An estimated 2,900 people lined the streets Thursday to see the first of the three days of parades.

Led by the color guard and the pert O'Donnell Eagle Band, the 8 block long parade included different riding clubs on each of the three days as well as some 30 parade entries including 15 beautiful floats.

Miss Helen Hoffman, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C. N. Hoffman, was Rodeo Queen riding on the queen float with her court. She was sponsored by the Lynn County Sheriff Posse.

Theme of the 1956 parade revolved around "Mother Goose" as well as other children stories with individual entries ranging from "Three Little Pigs" to "Snow White". Mrs. Bill Davis and Mrs. Pat Gary did a splendid job of planning and sparking the parade.

The judges selected the following floats as winners in the 1956 Rodeo parade —

The rodeo drew capacity gates except for Friday night when 1500 attended. Thursday's show drew an estimated 2500 roaring fans and Saturday's gates almost reached that number. Goat Mayo's stock was running over with atomic energy and the cow-pokes gave the stock a good ride. The Roping Club gave the town a good show and the town received much favorable comment from the large number rodeo visitors and local fans.

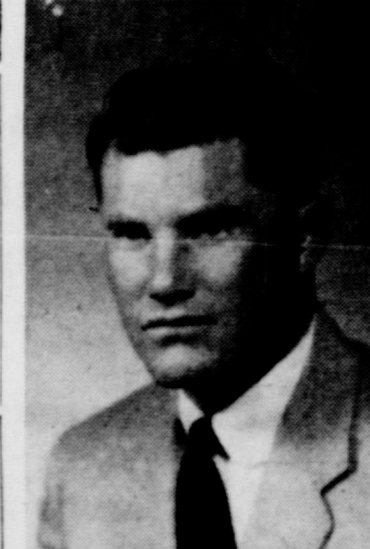

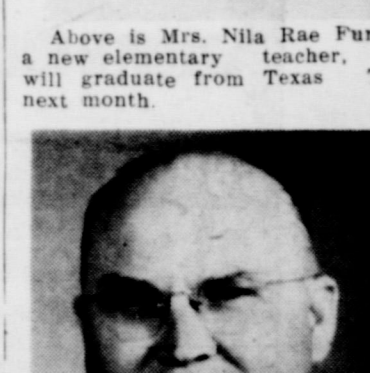
New Teachers
