THE IMPORTANCE OF BAPTISM

Baptism is important because it stands between the sinner and the remission of his sins, Acts 2:38. Baptism is important because it stands between the sinner and his membership in the church of which Christ is the Savior, I Corinthians 12:13; Ephesians 1:22, 23; 5:28. Baptism is important because it stands between the sinner and his reception of all the spiritual blessings that are in Christ, Ephesians 1:3; Galatians 3: 27; Romans 6:3. Baptism is important because it stands between the sinner and salvation, I Peter 3:21; Mark 16:15, 16.

Many people have been deceived into believing that baptism is not "for" the remission of sins, but that one is baptized "because" his sins have already been forgiven. The only thing wrong with this belief is that it has the misfortune of contradicting the plain statement of the inspired writer of the book of Acts. (Acts 2:38) Others believe that baptism is essential for church membership, but not for salvation. In other words, one can be saved and go to heaven without being baptized and without being a member of a church. It is certainly true that one can be saved without being a member of any man-made church, but it is not true that one can be saved without being a member of the church which Christ purchased with His own blood. One can only become a member of Christ's church by being scripturally baptized, I Corinthians 12: 13, and when one is scripturally baptized he can no more stay out of the church than he could have stayed out of the family into which he was physically born. The Lord himself adds all baptized believers to the church, Acts 2:47.

Have you been scripturally baptized for the remission of your sins. If not, you need to seriously consider the teaching of the above scriptures.

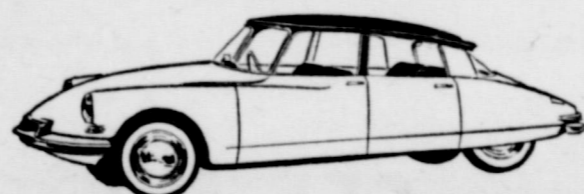

WOMEN AGE 62 AND OVER MAY CAN DRAW S. S.

Of importance to all women the recent change in the law permits those who have reached 62 years of age or older and who otherwise be eligible to receive social security benefits, to begin doing so as early as November this year.

This new law also affects women whose husbands are drawing social security benefits, dependent mothers and widows of insured persons, and women who have established their own social security earnings account by having worked in employment covered by the Social Security Act or operated their own businesses.

Benefits may be paid to the younger women beginning in November. However, they may apply for these benefits as late as November of 1957 and not lose any payments as they are retroactive for as much as 12 months.

A representative of the Lamesa Social Security Office will be in O'Donnell Oct. 17 at 3 p. m. at post office and will be glad to help in all matters pertaining to Social Security.

NO HELP IN BEING FEARFUL OF CANCER, SAYS DOCTOR

Fear of cancer cannot help victim, and unreasonable action concerning this disease, the opinion of Dr. Hollis, Commissioner of Health.

The doctor said that cancer usually be cured in its early stages, before it spreads to other areas of the body. This has been demonstrated by the fact that persons have been treated successfully by surgery, radium, or x-rays and are now living, many years after a definite diagnosis of cancer was made. Many people postpone diagnosis when they suspect cancer either because they dread hearing the truth or because they believe that a cure is impossible.

In the treatment of cancer, the most important factor, according to Dr. Hollis, is to obtain satisfactory results, treatment must begin early in the course of the disease while the cancer is confined to a small area. Persons suspecting cancer should consult their doctor as soon as they notice any unexplainable lump, unusual discharge, a persistent sore on any part of the body or a change in the appearance of a wart. It is disastrous to wait for pain as this is a late symptom that usually doesn't occur until malignant growth has made considerable advance.

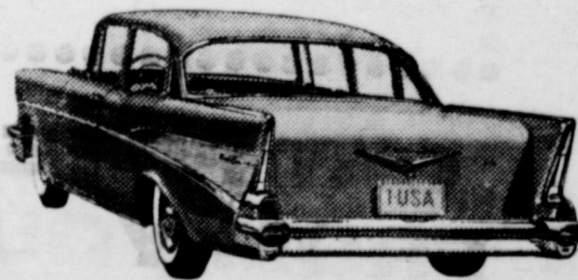

NO HELP IN BEING FEARFUL OF CANCER, SAYS DOCTOR

Fear of cancer cannot help its victim, and unreasonable fear should be replaced by intelligent action concerning this disease, is the opinion of Dr. Holle, Commissioner of Health.

The doctor said that cancer can usually be cured in its earlier stages, before it spreads to other areas of the body. This has been demonstrated by the fact that many persons have been treated successfully by surgery, radium, or x-ray and are now living, many years after a definite diagnosis of early cancer was made. Many people postpone diagnosis when they suspect cancer either because they dread to hear the truth or because they believe that a cure is impossible.

In the treatment of cancer, time is the most important factor, according to Dr. Holle. To produce satisfactory results, treatment must begin early in the course of the disease while the cancer is confined to a small area.

Persons suspecting cancer should consult their doctor as soon as they notice any unexplainable lump, unusual discharge, a persistent sore on any part of the body or any change in the appearance of a mole or wart. It is disastrous to wait for pain as this is a late symptom that usually doesn't occur until the malignant growth has made much advance.

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This new law also affects women whose husbands are drawing social security benefits, dependent mothers and widows of insured persons, and women who have established their own social security earnings account by having worked in employment covered by the Social Security Act or operated their own businesses.

Benefits may be paid to these younger women beginning in November. However, they may make application for these benefits as late as November of 1957 and still not lose any payments as they can be retroactive for as much as 12 months.

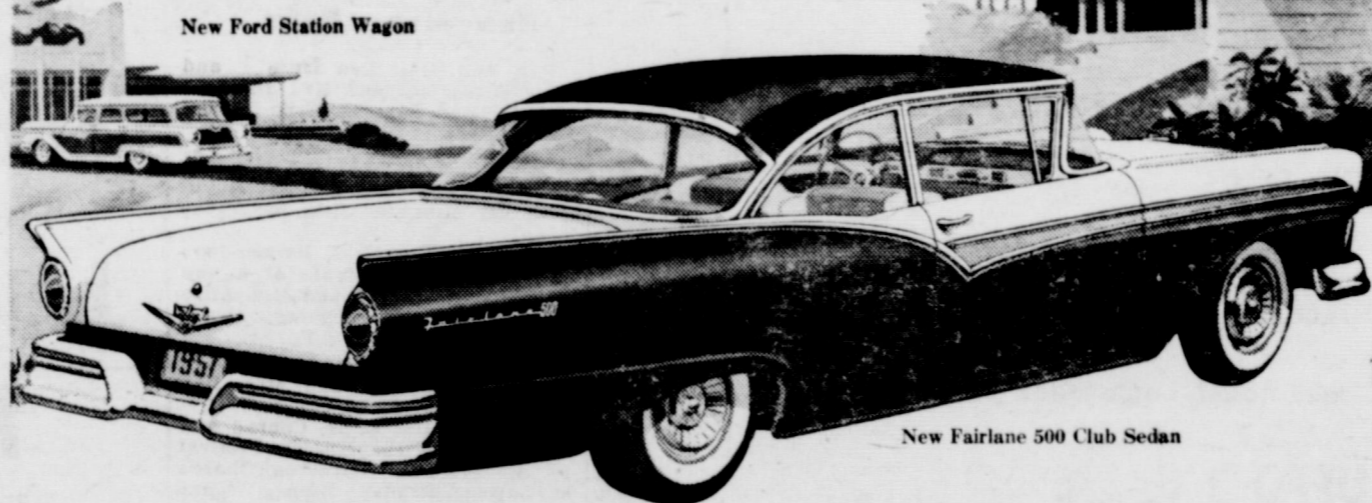
"I may be stubborn," said Old Man Jones, "but I just ain't been convinced that President Eisenhower is keeping it from raining."
