Q- I'm a World War Two vet eran and I understand that a new law now gives me until July 25, 19 60, to get a GI loan. Has the deadine also been extended for direct

VA loan? Yes. The direct loan program, which was to have ended June 30 1958, also was extended to July 25,

I lost the discharge I received when I came out of service. Where do I get another and is there any charge for the replacement?

A— To replace a lost discharge,

write to the Personnel Rerords Center of the Armed Forces, 9700 Page Boulevard, St. Louis, Missouri Give your service number and include your branch of service. There is no charge for replacement.

Q- I'm a Korea veteran, figuring on starting school this fall under the GI Bill. Is it too early to apply now?

A- It is not too early to apply Many schools are crowded, so early application gives you a better chance of gaining admittance to the school of your choice.

Q— I'm a veteran with a serice-connected disability rated 50 percent, and with two dependents, my wife and our three-months old son, However, I have only recently notified VA of my new dependent. Will the additional compensation to which I am entitled be made retroactive to the child's birth?





Twister Rules Given

Next month Texans will note the fifth anniversary of an event which transformed the neat center of a city into a twisted debris laden mess in a matter of seconds — the Waco Tornado.

Perhaps the best way to homage to the scores of people who lost their lives in the Waco disaster would be to heed and learn the proper means of protecting selves whenever a tornado threat.

An elaborate tornado detection warning system is now in operation thruout Texas and neighboring states with the central bureau in Kansas City. Whenever compiled weather indicate, the Kansas City bureau alerts all weath er bureaus in the affected which in turn notify all local media of mass information such as radio and TV stations.

These stations then announce a severe weather alert carefully describing areas in which strong weather will occur. This does NOT mean a tornado is going to occur but it does mean that conditions are such that a tornado could develop.

From this point the weather bur eau, the Ground Observer Corps and the Department of Public Safety work hand in hand. Whenever radar picks up a likely trouble spot, a patrol is dispatched to the location to check. If it is a tornado, the direction, approximate speed and exact location are determined by both the patrolman and by the use of three radar stations getting a fix on the trouble point.

Radio and TV stations are then immediately notified and a TORN-ADO WARNING is issued describing the direction and speed. This is the time to take action

No Tornado warning is issued until an actual tornado has been sighted and verified. A period of severe weather alert is a time to prepare for action — but a tornado warning means act — and act fast. Keep tuned to your radio or TV set and you will be immediately informed.

If at home the southwest corner of the house offers greatest safety. Electricity and fuel lines should be turned off. Windows on the north and east sides of the house may also be opened to help reduce damage to the building. If you have a storm cellar - use it.



Free Speech Issue In Court Proceeding

LINCOLN, Ill.-Free speech was the issue here in a contempt of court case in which nearly 600 persons faced possible fines and jail

The defendants, many of them members of a reform group known as the "Good Government Council of Logan County," were cited for contempt for petitioning Circuit Judge Frank M. Bevan to replace a state's attorney in a case involving the prosecutor's friend.

Judge Bevan said the petition contained "odious, defamatory language concerning an official of this court," State's Attorney Edwin C.

Members of the Good Government Council contended Judge Bevan could not hold them in contempt and said if the prosecutor felt he was defamed by the petition he could sue them in a civil

The case arose when, as a result of action taken by the Good Government Council, Justice of the Peace Vincent Jones was charged with illegal diversion of funds collected in overweight trucking fines. Mr. Jones was charged with perjury, embezzlement and malfeas-

The council followed up the case with a petition asking that Mr. Jones, be replaced by a special or assistant prosecutor.

-0-Of special interest to disabled workers is the provision of the Social Security Act which provides for disability payments at age 50. In order to qualify for these benefits. the disabled person must be unable to perform any substantial gainful activity and must have worked under social security for at least 5 out of 10 years immediately preceding the date he became disabled. At least a year and a half of this work must have been during the three years just before the disability be-

gan. In addition the disabled individual must have filed an application for these benefits. Disabled workers who have been unable to work for a prolonged per-iod may lose their rights to disabpayments at age 50 if they do not file an application before June 30th, Failure to file for these disability provisions may also affect their rights to benefits upon retire-ment and to benefits for their survivors in the event of the worker's death. Any disabled person who meets the requirements set forth above is urged to contact his nearest social security office. If the individual is unable to make this contact in person, a friend or relative may notify the Social Security office.


